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# 5 Ways to Hire an Awesome Real Estate Agent

The agent will have an in-depth knowledge of local market trends and the best properties on sale that suit your budget and needs.

#### **Tip #3: Vet Potential Agents**

You can learn a lot by running a simple Google search. Visit an agent's website. Check their active and inactive social media accounts. Look out for online reviews. One or two negative reviews isn't a problem. But anything more than that is worrying.

Check if the agents are licensed with the state regulatory agency. Also, check if they have any disciplinary issues or fines they need to pay.

You can also vet them with the local "Better Business Bureau's" site to see if other home buyers

and sellers have flagged them. You can now shortlist at least three top candidates.

# Tip #4: Interview for Experience and Working Style

Now that you have shortlisted at least three potential candidates, it's time to speak with them. When interviewing these agents, you are looking out for their experience and their working style.

But don't forget to get a sense of their familiarity with your dream area. You also have an opportunity to discuss the agent's preferred form of communication and their working hours. If you're available to check out homes during the weekend, you want an agent who's available during that period.

### Tip #5: Ask for References

Ask each agent to share information on homes they've sold or listed in the past 12 months. They should also share the contact information of a few of their clients.

Call the clients and ask what their experience was working with the agent. Plus the level of support the agent provided throughout the buying or selling process. Finally, ask if they would hire the agent again next time.
