## An Artist Responds to Our Nuclear World

You may be tempted to fast-forward past the mid-point, until the video pops and beeps like a game. But that would lose the meditative quality of Japanese artist Isao Hashimoto's time-lapse of the 2053 nuclear explosions that took place from 1945-1998.

The half-life of plutonium-238 is 87 years, and there are about 14,000 nuclear warheads worldwide today. In comparison, the 14 minutes it takes to watch this video are trivial.
