1. Dancin' from Mexico

Just ahead of the real Mexican Independence Day (which is September 16, not Cinco de Mayo), **Grandeza Mexicana Folk Ballet** displays why it is one of SoCal's most popular folkloric troupes. Expect the troupe's signature meticulous footwork and exuberantly colored costumes as the ensemble celebrates director Jose Vences 25th anniversary with dances that capture Mexico's varied regions. Known for careful research into the regional cultures underlying his choreography, Vences unveils a new work for this celebration. Although the troupe doesn't usually perform to live music, this anniversary event brings **La Banda De Tlayacapan** from Mexico to accompany the festivities.
