Gender on stage

Two days of performance by six LA-based companies and choreographers are the culminating events of *Gender View*, a multi-day exploration of dance choreography inspired by gender identity representation in different artistic genres and different cultures. The classes and workshops examine and consider visual and written work drawn from Russia, Asia, Africa, Europe and the Americas for insights into how gender in art reflects and is reflected in the dominant culture and its undercurrents. The two performances include work derived from those explorations. Participating choreographers include Grethcin Ackerman/Alejandro Perez, Seda Abay with her Kybele Dance Theatre, Andrea Burr/Jules Mara/Himerria Wortham, Brian Frette, Charlotte Katherine and Co., and Deborah Brockus, event producer and artistic director of the host company **BrockusRED**.
