The company and Karlin are known for taking their time, *Formulae* incubated for several years during which the company previewed tantalizing segments as the work matured into its final polished product exploring the life of Alan Turing, the mathematical genius who led the WWII decoding of the Nazi 'Enigma Machine' only to be prosecuted for homosexuality.
