#### The 5th edition

Based on the simple premise that dance belongs everywhere and to everyone, Elgart and *Cultural Weekly* (now *Cultural Daily*) launched *Dare 2 Dance in Public* in 2015. The online magazine invited submissions of short dance films responding to the challenge to dance in public places. The response was tremendous and a festival was born.
