Wood

- Is not as tough as wood
- Can get damaged easily and not strong weather durable
- Has less variety to choose from

Aluminum

- Is much more weather durable and can withstand climate and nature issues
- Requires little to no maintenance
- Least costly of the materials commonly used for patio covers
- Need to check on your local ordinances in using aluminum

Alumawood combines all the good things of all these three materials- the strength of aluminum, the authenticity, and variety of wood and the low maintenance of vinyl. It makes the best all-round choice for homeowners looking to install patio covers.

Types of Shading

Another aspect of your patio cover that you want to consult with your patio contractor is the type of shading. Knowing the type of shading will also give you a better idea of the costs involved and which shading works out for your needs and your home. Here are some common types of shading:

• The Awning

Awnings act like curtains, except instead of draping down, they extend outwardly. You can choose between traditional awnings or high-tech awnings, depending on your budget. The ideal benefit for this awning is to provide shade and as long as that fulfills your needs, that's great. Awnings can be in vinyl or fabric, both with its own pros and cons.

• Lattice

Lattice provides a simpler form of shading and they are also thinner. It leaves space for the sun, and it is also aesthetically pleasing to a home's overall presence. Homeowners also grow creeper plants so it can intertwine in the lattice, creating a whimsical and beautiful look. Lattices are usually made out of wood.

• Solid covers

If the area where your home is has very harsh sunlight streaming through, you might want to consider solid patio covers as it creates better and higher protection from the sun and weather. This can also add value to your property if you ever want to sell it in the future. Depending on the orientation of your home, solid covers need to be robust in order to lessen the harsh rays of the sun but still allow the warmth to get in. Solid covers are also beneficial in places where there's torrid rains and strong winds.

• DIY

If you feel like you do not have the budget to hire a patio contractor, there are other DIY options that you can choose which is to get your own patio cover kit and set it up on your own.
