Live This Week

Dance binging

Bringing an approach dubbed a "mini-fest," *Dance at the Odyssey* curated by Barbara Mueller–Wittmann concentrates nine world premieres in a brief two weeks. For Friday's opening and Saturday's matinee choreographer **Corina Kinnear** and **Hannah Millar** share the stage. Kinnear's premiere considers *Lost Time*. Millar's new works include a solo, *Everything Up To Now*, and *Boxed* about feeling trapped, plus an excerpt from her full-length touring work *Let Us Bleed, Then Heal*. On Saturday, choreographer **Alejandro Perez**'s premiere, *Side by Side*, explores how movers from diverse backgrounds can hone their different experiences into a collective identity. Bio-ballet and some films

The finale for this year's *Gloria Kaufman Presents Dance* series brings a bio-ballet plus a minifilm festival. The dance portion spotlights Europe's impressive and adventurous **Dutch National Ballet**, making its Music Center debut in *Frida*, choreographer Annabelle Lopez Ochoa's exploration of the life of Mexican artist and icon Frida Kahlo. As part of the Dutch National Ballet's visit, the Music Center partnered with Dance Camera West to sponsor a dance film festival, *Dance in Focus: REFLECTIONS*. Finalist films from more than 300 entries were selected by the judges and will screen outside in the plaza in conjunction with the performances and inside the theater for ticket holders.
