### Festival moves

Hosted by **MashUp Contemporary Dance Company**, this year's *International Women's Day Dance Festival* expands to three days and travels among several venues for with performances showcasing women choreographers, a dance film festival, an awards presentation, workshops, and classes. The selected filmmakers are Christina Camacho, Jordyn Apostolache, Hanna DiLorenzo, Fina Ferrara, Tamara Ayrapetyan, Laura Arend, and Brian Ca. Friday also includes presentation of "Exemplary Women in Dance" awards to LA-based dancemakers Boróka Nagy and Vanessa Hernández Cruz. Saturday offers two performances, both with choreography from Margaux Gex, Isabella Lown, Kamryn Funk, Katie Hazard, Mia Giovanna Kuzma, Rebecca Horner, Ariel Scott, Amaya Alvarado, Neaz Kohani, and Jordyn Santiago. In *Re:Bound, A Winter Repertory Performance*, Walker and his dancers bring *Birthday Variations*, Arpino's take on ballet music that Giuseppe Verdi added to his operas for Paris performances. ### **Ballet double bill**

Continuing its commitment to ballets by George Balanchine, **American Contemporary Ballet** offers a double bill with live music under the banner *Balanchine: Twin Masterpieces*. ACB touts that these have never been performed together before, a fact that may reflect the ballets' structural similarities. Set to Bach's *Concerto for Two Violins*, Balanchine's *Concerto Barocco* captures Bach's first and second violins in two female dancers with the corps articulating the orchestra. Created in 1941, a time Balanchine's fledgling ballet company was shy on male dancers, *Barocco* has a cast of 11 women and one man called upon for strong partnering skills in the middle movement. With music by Leo Delibes, Balanchine created *La Source* in 1961 as a pas de deux for Violette Verdy and John Prinz, and later expanded the work, surrounding the duo with an all-female corps de ballet. The company includes several seasoned dancers including Maté Szentes and Madeline Houk, who know their Balanchine. ACB Studios, Bank of America Plaza, 333 S. ### **Surviving uncertain times**

When it premiered 30 years ago in the midst of the AIDS epidemic, a major reviewer declared that the text woven through the choreography, words from real people living with life-threatening illnesses, made *Still/Here* unreviewable. The controversy that ensued surrounded the reviewer, choreographer Bill T. Jones, and his company **Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Company** that still bore the name of his life and dance partner who died from AIDS. The powerful work at the center became known more for the furor than the substance and message of the crafted work. With this landmark return, the company and choreographer reprise the work with its consideration of survival, memory and what it means to live fully in uncertain times, ready to be viewed through a new lens after three decades, the Covid-19 pandemic, and swirling contemporary life-threatening uncertainties, not all related to health. ## The Evolution of Business Education in the Digital Age

## Photographing Black Life in a Turbulent Time

The [J. Paul Getty Museum](#) in Los Angeles has just opened a major exhibition, *Photography and*

*the Black Arts Movement*, that depicts the African-American community with a particular focus on the protests and social change of the 1960s and 1970s.

There are straightforward black-and-white images that document the civil rights movement and its leadership. There are also works ranging from quiet portraits of private life to colorfully arty combinations of photography integrated into paintings and sculptures. The photographers and artists represented in the show include famous names such as Gordon Parks, Carrie Mae Weems, and Betye Saar, though most are relatively unknown.

*Protest Car* of 1962 by Harry Adams, who worked for the Los Angeles Sentinel and other publications, is a good example of the show’s “straight” photography. In the center of the shot is a two-door sedan completely covered with painted slogans, such as “EQUAL RIGHTS FOR ALL AMERICANS”; on the left side of the road is a man carrying a large sign saying “We Are TIRED of WAITING” at the front of a line of protesters. The image is strong and completely self-explanatory.

Gordon Parks' *Ethel Sharrieff in Chicago*, 1963, is a clearly posed portrait of the daughter of Elijah Muhammad, the leader of the Nation of Islam. Dressed entirely in white, she stands unsmiling before dozens of other identically dressed Black Muslim women. They look like soldiers standing at attention, arranged in a triangular pattern that seems to recede forever. It's a memorable image that also comes close to an advertisement.

Betye Saar's assemblage/sculpture of 1972, *Let Me Entertain You*, combines three images within an old wooden window frame. On the left a colorfully dressed, banjo-playing minstrel poses against an orange-colored background. In the center, the same image is repeated in black and white, overlaid against a gruesome historical photograph of a lynching. Several white men (and a woman) mill around the site, smiling, smoking cigars, pointing to the two victims still hanging from a tree. At the bottom of the center window frame, a tiny skull has been inserted into the brass lock fixture, grinning out at the viewer.

On the right side of the window frame is an image of a young Black man, sporting black clothes and an Afro haircut, holding a rifle in the same stance as the banjo players. In the background is the red, black, and green Black Liberation flag designed by Marcus Garvey more than a century ago. The cumulative effect of the three panels is, to say the least, powerful and thought-provoking.

Another graphically strong image of protest, with an historically important back story, is *I Am a Man, Sanitation Workers Strike, Memphis, Tennessee*, photographed on March 28, 1968, by Ernest C. Withers. After two sanitation workers were killed on the job by a malfunctioning garbage truck on February 1, 1968, about 1,300 workers went out on strike 11 days later.

Tensions mounted after Mayor Henry Loeb rebuffed the union's demands for wage increases and better working conditions. Martin Luther King Jr. briefly visited Memphis on March 18, delivering a major speech to a crowd of 25,000.

Ten days later, the hundreds of workers depicted in Withers' photograph marched again, carrying signs proclaiming I AM A MAN and repeating their demands. King returned to Memphis on March 28 and again on April 4, when he delivered his famous "I've seen the promised land" speech. On the following day he was assassinated on the balcony of his Memphis motel.

Many but not all of the photographs in the Getty exhibition focus on the turmoil of the time. There also are quiet portraits and landscapes, and one of the most touching is *Jake With His Boat Arriving on Daufuskie's Shore, Daufuskie Island, South Carolina*, photographed in 1978 by Jeanne Moutoussamy-Ashe (the wife of tennis star Arthur Ashe).

Fedora-wearing Jake, a member of the isolated island's Gullah population, stands in the stern of his rowboat and maneuvers toward the shore with one oar. He's surrounded by an overhanging tree limb on the right and more vegetation on the left. The image is both simple and elegant, a reminder of a now-lost world.

*Photography and the Black Arts Movement* runs through June 14 at the [J. Paul Getty Museum](#) in Los Angeles. The exhibition was organized by the National Gallery of Art in Washington, where it was on view from September 21, 2025, to January 11, 2026. The show travels to the Mississippi Museum of Art in Jackson, Mississippi, from July 25 to November 8. A 288-page catalog is published by Yale University Press.

## Living Abroad? Financial Tips You Can't Afford to Miss

Living abroad is exciting. It is also financially complex.

A new country brings opportunity, growth, and a broader perspective. It also introduces unfamiliar banking systems, tax rules, currencies, and costs that can quietly strain your budget if you are not prepared. Financial stability does not happen by chance when you move overseas. It requires planning, structure, and constant awareness.

If you are preparing for an international move—or already navigating one—these financial tips will help you stay secure, organized, and confident.

## Understand the True Cost of Living

Before you move, **research the obvious expenses**. Then look deeper.

Most people check rent prices and grocery costs. That is a start, but it is rarely enough. You should also account for:

- Utilities and internet
- Health insurance or national healthcare fees
- Transportation passes or fuel costs
- Visa renewals and residency permits
- Local taxes
- Schooling (if applicable)
- Emergency healthcare deposits
- Banking and ATM fees

Small differences add up quickly. A country may appear cheaper on paper, yet mandatory health contributions or higher utility rates can narrow that gap fast.

Exchange rates also affect your real cost of living. If your income is tied to your home currency, fluctuations can significantly increase monthly expenses. A favorable rate today may shift tomorrow.

Run your numbers conservatively. Always leave room for variation.

## Build a Financial Cushion Before You Go

Moving abroad comes with surprises. Some are cultural. Others are financial.

Deposits for housing can be higher than expected. Certain countries require several months' rent upfront. You may need to furnish an apartment from scratch. Initial paperwork can involve translation, notarization, and legal fees.

An emergency fund becomes even more important overseas. Aim for at least three to six months of living expenses, ideally held in an accessible account. If possible, split funds between two financial institutions to reduce risk.

International life is rewarding. But it is rarely predictable.

## International Transfers: Minimize Fees and Maximize

## Efficiency

If you earn in one country and spend in another, transfers become part of daily life.

Traditional banks often charge high wire fees and apply less favorable exchange rates. Over time, this can cost hundreds—or thousands—per year. Compare providers carefully. Look at both the upfront fee and the exchange margin.

Digital financial platforms frequently offer better rates and faster processing. Some allow you to schedule recurring transfers, which can simplify budgeting. Others provide rate alerts so you can move funds when the timing is right.

When you need to **send money abroad**, choose services that are transparent about their pricing structure and exchange rate spreads. A low transfer fee does not always mean a better deal if the exchange rate is inflated.

## Manage Currency Exchange Strategically

You need to determine whether you can continue **contributing to retirement accounts** in your home country. Some plans have restrictions once you are no longer a resident. Others remain accessible.

At the same time, you may gain access to pension systems in your host country. Understand vesting periods and portability rules before contributing.

If you plan to stay abroad long-term, consider:

- How currency fluctuations will affect retirement savings
- Where you intend to retire
- How social security agreements between countries apply

Retirement planning becomes global when you move internationally. Treat it that way.

## Protect Yourself With Proper Insurance

Insurance systems differ widely between countries.

In some places, national healthcare is comprehensive. In others, private insurance is essential. Even if you qualify for public healthcare, supplemental private coverage may reduce waiting times or expand treatment options.

You should evaluate:

- Health insurance
- Disability insurance
- Liability coverage
- Renters or homeowners insurance
- Travel insurance for regional trips

Do not assume coverage transfers automatically from your home country. Many policies do not extend internationally.

Protection is not exciting. But it is necessary.

## Maintain Access to Credit

Credit systems do not automatically follow you across borders.

Your credit history in one country may not transfer to another. This can affect your ability to rent housing, finance a car, or secure a mortgage.

Before leaving your home country, consider:

- Keeping at least one credit card open
- Maintaining a small recurring charge to preserve account activity
- Monitoring your credit score

In your new country, begin building local credit early if possible. This may involve opening a local credit card or taking out a small installment loan and repaying it responsibly.

Strong credit expands your financial options. Weak or nonexistent credit restricts them.

## Adjust Your Investment Strategy

Investing while living abroad requires additional awareness.

Some brokerage accounts restrict access once you become a non-resident. Others allow continued management but limit new investments. Regulatory rules vary widely.

Currency exposure also plays a larger role. If you invest in assets denominated in one currency but plan to spend in another, exchange rate movements can influence returns.

Diversification should include:

- Geographic exposure
- Currency allocation
- Asset types

Be cautious about investing in unfamiliar financial products simply because they are popular locally. Conduct independent research. Understand risk levels and liquidity terms.

International life often broadens perspective. Your investment strategy should reflect that, but

thoughtfully.

## Track Spending More Closely Than Before

**Moving abroad** can distort your sense of value.

Prices feel different when converted mentally. What seems inexpensive in local currency may be costly relative to your income. Conversely, you may overspend because everything feels temporarily novel.

Use budgeting tools or expense-tracking apps to monitor:

- Housing
- Dining
- Transportation
- Entertainment
- Subscriptions

Revisit your budget every few months. Costs shift as you settle in. Initial excitement fades. Reality sets in. Structure keeps your finances stable during that transition.

## Prepare for Repatriation or the Next Move

Many international assignments are temporary. Even open-ended moves can change direction.

Plan ahead for:

- Moving expenses
- Shipping or storage costs
- Currency conversion back to your home currency
- Closing local accounts
- Tax clearance certificates

Re-entry can be financially challenging. You may face higher living costs than you remember. Your home-country credit profile may need rebuilding. Having a clear exit strategy reduces stress later.

Global mobility is rarely static. Plan for change.

## Final Thoughts

Living abroad expands your world. It challenges assumptions and builds resilience. But it also demands financial discipline.

Banking systems differ. Tax rules shift. Exchange rates fluctuate. Without careful planning, small inefficiencies can compound into significant losses.

The key is awareness. Understand your obligations. Monitor your cash flow. Protect your assets. Stay flexible.

Sigourney Weaver, having been directed by James Cameron in *Aliens* (1986), sequel to *Alien* (1979) by Ridley Scott, agreed to act in *Avatar* (2009). She accepted Cameron's invitation to play a different character, the teenage girl Kiri, in the sequels *Avatar: The Way of Water* (2022) and *Avatar: Fire and Ash* (2025).

She explained: “When you are 14, even though life is complicated, you’re still a joyous creature, and despite the strain of the battle, the fact that we won, the sadness of losing her brother Neteyam is weighing heavily on Kiri.”

In 1986 about *Aliens*. My interview was published in the Italian weekly *Domenica del Corriere*.


In 1988, about *Gorillas in the Mist* by Michael Apted, my interview was published in the Italian fashion weekly *Gioia*.

In 2023, I wrote [an article](#) for the Golden Globes website about *Call Jane* where Sigourney Weaver played a feminist mentor.

My intro: “Many women rightly feared that, after the election of Donald Trump as President of the United States in 2016, aided by a Republican majority in the Senate, he would appoint conservative judges to the Supreme Court, whose goal would be to curtail women’s freedom of choice. This is exactly what happened, on June 24, 2022, when the constitutional right to abortion, guaranteed by the *Roe v. Wade* since 1973, was overturned by the *Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health Organization* decision, leaving legislation regulating abortion up to the individual states rather than the federal government.”

The reason why I decided to feature Sigourney Weaver now is because she has been outspoken in her support for Hillary Clinton in the 2016 Presidential elections, and in 2024 for Kamala Harris.



Editing my more than twenty interviews with this amazing actress, while working on my archives, I noticed the consistency of her political views.

In December 2004, after George W. Bush was elected President a second time, she said to HFPA journalists:

“As you get older, you're still protesting the Vietnam War; and now there's another war (Iraq). I look at the men in this country who don't want to have a woman President or to pay women the same salaries as the men get, and I understand it, it's like the survival of the species. One of the reasons that our voting process is so difficult, that it's hard to get people out to vote is that both parties have underfunded education for the last 20 or 30 years, and we're seeing the results now. We really need to start talking to each other, the two sides, red and blue, we need to make some purple.”



In 2012, in the TV miniseries *Political Animals*, Sigourney Weaver played a former First Lady who divorced her cheating husband, was elected Governor of Illinois, lost her bid to be the Presidential candidate for the Democratic party, the male candidate who won appointed her as Secretary of State.

During our HFPA interview, Weaver claimed that she was not playing Hillary Clinton, whom she had never yet met, but that series creator Greg Berlanti had Madeleine Albright in mind.

“I’m playing a very accomplished stateswoman, I also am a mother dealing with very complicated situations. I took it for granted, just like everybody, that we would eventually have a woman president. One of the reasons we all wanted to do this show was to try to move that dialogue further and investigate some of the reasons why Americans, men and women, aren’t willing to see how capable women are. It’s an odd thing, I don’t really understand it.”

“I’m a big Obama supporter. I’m confident that he’s going to win and that he will use his second term not to define policy but to take action, because initially he didn’t understand how badly we need him to take the reins and go. And then I hope Hillary will run and win and have one more term.”
