As much as possible, avoid sellers who try to pressure you into buying something or who won't respond to basic questions regarding the violin. Phishing assessments and too glossy photos are common tools used by scammers. Price seems too good to be true? It probably is!

- Buy from reputable marketplaces or respectable music retailers.
- Use safe and buyer-protecting payment methods.
- Never be afraid to ask the vendor specific questions regarding the violin.
- Try renting a violin before you decide to buy.
- Read the return policy of the shop before signing the contract.
