Share Details About Your Injuries and Recovery

If your care continues in Denver, mention future appointments and expected therapies. Provide receipts and prescriptions to support your account. This information helps build a strong case and supports accurate valuation of your losses.

Understand Communication and Next Steps

Ask how the lawyer prefers to communicate and how often you will receive updates. Clear expectations reduce confusion and keep you informed as your case progresses. You should also learn what actions will occur after the meeting.
