### **Minimum Download Speed Requirements for Streaming**

The minimum download speed requirements for most of the streaming platforms at different resolutions is given below:

Resolution	Min. Download Speeds
Standard Definition Display (SD)	3-10 Mbps
HD	10-18 Mbps
Ultra HD	18-25 Mbps
4K	25 Mbps

### Minimum Upload Speed Requirements for Live Streaming

Following are the minimum upload speed requirements for different live-streaming platforms:

#### Facebook Live

Resolution	Min. Upload Speed
1080p with 60 Fps	6-7 Mbps
720p with 60 Fps	3-4 Mbps

#### YouTube Live

Resolution	Min. Upload Speed
720p video at 30 FPS	2-5 Mbps
720p video at 60 FPS	2.9-7.4 Mbps
1080p video at 30 FPS	3.8-7.4 Mbps
1080p video at 60 FPS	5.6-11 Mbps
1440p video at 30 FPS	7.4-15.8 Mbps
1440p video at 60 FPS	11-21.8 Mbps
4K video at 30 FPS	15.8-41 Mbps
4K video at 60 FPS	24.2-61.5 Mbps
