Watson, an Afghanistan war vet, works in an inner-city clinic; Holmes is a local P.I. who takes unusual cases.

Following the strong digital success of Karl and Rick's creation, it's time to move it to physical print and get it into comic book shops nationwide. They've launched a Kickstarter campaign to expand their outreach, and need to raise \$7,500 by May 8, 2013.
