### California Dreamin'

1.

I walked on glass, at Pomona, at seventeen, I walked on glass,  
gravel glass, rainbow-hued and waved smooth by rolling tires.  
Barefoot always, I carried shoes for show when required, my own  
soles thick and brown like home-grown leather. I stopped eating  
meat, started smoking for real, and wore cheap nightgowns  
as dresses under sweater vests and vintage men's jackets packed  
in a peeling cardboard trunk that flew with me from New York  
to a school I chose because it was on the other side of the country,  
in California, the idyll in songs by folk-rock troubadours,  
who lived in houses on stilts, high in the canyons of the Hollywood  
Hills. I thought *I'd be safe and warm if I was in LA*, or at least  
in a nearby ivied ivory tower, with beaches, and sun, sun, sun.  
Distances were so much greater when life hunkered down in real  
places and flying stopped time. Nothing could touch you up there.  
Engine noise blocked my ears, silenced the voice in my head,  
and my eyes marveled at the sight of the Rockies from above.  
It was a slow glide to a new life in a new land and everyone  
applauded a safe landing.

I arrived a day late and missed the last weighing and measuring  
of the freshman women by the football team—a tradition the captain  
described as “really just fun” as he flipped through the student *Look  
Book* with the figures listed beneath the women's photos. That night  
was the first time I ever slept at ground level. People could walk  
right up to my window, and a man woke me up at midnight, scratching  
at the screen, looking for Diane. The next morning, facing me  
outside the front door was a snow-capped mountain that hadn't  
been there the day before. Like the backdrop in a play, Mount  
Baldy flew in and out with the smog, its peak a French-tipped nail

scraping the sky. Behind the dorm bandana-collared dogs jumped for frisbees on Walker Beach, the back lawn, grass not sand, while in the basement laundry Bonnie Beyer hung her pastel-colored panties embroidered with the days of the week. Every night the ache of Carole King singing “So Far Away” drifted across the quad, the tinkling piano jarringly out of sync with the chinka chinka of sprinklers misting the close-cropped St. Augustine grass that tickled my feet when I walked to class.

I studied religion because I couldn’t understand how anyone could believe in god and the philosophy department was a bunch of leaches. I argued with a visiting artist holding court in the Coop, who announced, “Here’s the real deal” before asserting that pretty women had a duty to dress nicely. He wasn’t in the audience when I confused everyone by walking down the aisle at a Julian Bream concert in a vintage lace dress and crown of pink roses.

One weekend I took a double-date hike in Palm Springs Canyon led by Brenda’s boyfriend David, a Vietnam vet, the only survivor of his marine platoon, who brought ropes and pitons in case we had to “traverse a rock crevice” and wounded but did not kill a rattlesnake. Brenda was also from New York but was lucky to be in California when she got pregnant and needed an abortion. David took so long picking her up from the clinic I got worried, but it turned out she was hungry and they stopped for a burger.

Curtis was our only friend who didn’t have to worry about the draft lottery, his doctor having certified he suffered from “disqualifying allergies.” For the college’s performance of *The Death of Buster Quinine*, “a sacramental farce and fire opera” with giant puppets and light sculptures that was being staged in a nearby quarry, he and David snuck a master *castillo* artist out of Mexico in the back of a truck, and helped him build a motorized exploding firework tower with spinning wheels and shooting stars, all with a lit cigarette hanging out of his mouth.

Every morning I looked for Mount Baldy, hoping to see its snowy peak rising from the desert palms that dotted the campus. But particulate matter isn’t magic mist and even when it was visible, it was always out of reach, hanging there in the distance like a postcard flashing “Wish You Were Here” in jaunty script from some future self that I was always looking for but was never going to find there. After two years I dropped out and headed back east, back to humidity, the neon flicker of fireflies, and the solemn silence of snow.

The average spend on an engagement ring dropped to \$5,200 last year, down from \$5,500 the year before, largely because lab-grown stones cost 30% to 50% less than their mined counterparts. And with 70% of buyers under 35 actively looking for sustainable alternatives, the demand for these stones is only increasing. The global market is expected to reach over \$91 billion by 2034, growing at a rate of about 13.4% annually, per Fortune Business Insights.

So where do you start? Here are 10 online retailers worth considering, beginning with the one that brings together craftsmanship, transparency, and personal service in a way that feels rare.

### 1. GOODSTONE: Handcrafted in Los Angeles, Built Around You

GOODSTONE takes a different approach to how an engagement ring gets made. Every ring is bespoke, handcrafted by generational artisans in their Los Angeles workshop. Casting, stone setting, finishing, and quality inspection all happen in sequence under one roof. Nothing is outsourced. Nothing is mass-produced.

The process starts with a conversation. You can meet with a designer virtually or in person, talk through what you want, and build the ring together from the ground up. You choose from 8 setting styles, including solitaire, pavé, bezel, halo, three stone, channel, vintage, and burnished, or you collaborate on something entirely custom. From the first sketch and CAD render to the finished piece, these are real designs built from real conversations.

All **lab-grown diamonds** at GOODSTONE are certified by the IGI or GIA and graded using the same 4Cs criteria applied to mined stones. They will not yellow or lose brilliance over time. Engagement ring settings start from \$1,925, and metal options include 14k gold, 18k gold, and platinum, with 14k being the most affordable entry point.

Every piece is made with 100% recycled precious metals, re-refined to match newly mined quality while using 95% less energy. All diamonds and gemstones are ethically sourced with full traceability and zero guesswork.

GOODSTONE also offers a lifetime warranty that never expires. That covers resizing, repairs, cleaning, stone tightening, prong checks, and gemstone replacement. Orders under \$10,000 ship via insured FedEx 2-Day, and orders over \$10,000 go out FedEx Overnight.

If you want to be involved in how your ring is designed and know exactly where and how it was made, this is the place.

## 2. Brilliant Earth: A Pioneer in Ethical Sourcing

Brilliant Earth was one of the first online retailers to carry lab-grown diamonds, going back to 2012. Their catalog is massive, with around 350,000 lab created stones available at any given time. Diamonds are certified through GIA, IGI, and HRD.

In 2023, they introduced a Carbon Capture collection featuring diamonds created using 100% renewable energy. They also offer **blockchain verification** and virtual try-on technology, which adds a layer of confidence for online buyers who want to inspect their options closely before purchasing.

Brilliant Earth has showrooms in several major cities, so in-person visits are possible if you prefer that. Their ethical sourcing philosophy extends beyond conflict-free labeling, with a focus on supply chain transparency.

## 3. James Allen: The 360-Degree Diamond View

James Allen changed online diamond shopping when it became the first retailer to offer 360-degree video of every stone. That feature still holds up and remains one of the best ways to evaluate a diamond remotely.

The company is owned by Signet Jewelers, the **largest jewelry company in the world**. Natural diamonds come with GIA certification, and lab-grown stones are IGI certified. James Allen offers a no-questions-asked return policy within 30 days of shipment, with a paid shipping label included.

Their selection is large, their interface is clean, and the ability to rotate and zoom into each stone makes the buying process feel grounded and informed.

## 4. VRAI: Sustainability from the Ground Up

VRAI is based in Los Angeles and focuses entirely on lab-grown diamonds. Their stones are created by parent company Diamond Foundry, and the brand puts a strong emphasis on environmental responsibility. No mining, no carbon emissions in production.

All **VRAI jewelry** is crafted in solid gold, never plated or vermeil, and they use **recycled gold**. The brand leans into a minimalist, modern design language that appeals to buyers looking for something understated and refined.

If sustainability is a primary concern and you prefer a curated, smaller collection over a massive catalog, VRAI is a solid choice.

## 5. Blue Nile: One of the Originals

Blue Nile has been around since the early days of online jewelry retail. They built their reputation on natural diamonds, but their lab-grown inventory has expanded steadily in recent years. All stones are certified by GIA or IGI.

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### Why Some Slots Instantly Feel “Right” to Play

Some pokies just click. [Online pokies Australia Pokie7](#) covers the full range, and that instant feeling of fit is more than intuition. RTP, volatility, hit frequency, feature structure, when these elements align with what a player actually wants from a session, the game feels right from the first spin. Understanding what drives that alignment makes finding the right title a lot more deliberate, and a lot more rewarding. This guide breaks down the mechanics behind that feeling and gives players at any online casino Australia platform the tools to find their best-fit title before committing to a session.

#### It Starts With Volatility Match

The single most common reason a pokie feels off is volatility mismatch. A player who wants steady, active play loads a high-volatility title and the rhythm feels slow. A player after a big moment loads a low-volatility game and gets a stream of small wins that feel like background noise.

When volatility matches the session goal, the game clicks almost immediately. Wins arrive at the expected rhythm, the bonus round triggers at the expected rate, and the session develops in a way that feels coherent.

Australian online pokies players who check volatility before loading a title report noticeably better sessions. It takes ten seconds. Most online casino Australia platforms list it in the game info tab.

#### Hit Frequency and the Rhythm of a Session

Volatility and hit frequency are related but separate. A title with 25% hit frequency lands a win on roughly one in four spins. At 10%, wins arrive less often but tend to carry more weight when they do.

The rhythm this creates is central to how a game feels. Here’s how different hit frequency ranges tend to play out:

Hit Frequency	Session Feel	Best Suited For
30%+	Active, wins land constantly	Long, relaxed sessions
20–30%	Steady with room to breathe	Balanced play

10–20%	Builds anticipation between wins	Feature-driven sessions
Under 10%	Longer gaps, bigger payouts	Short, targeted sessions

Players who prefer a certain rhythm tend to gravitate toward the same hit frequency range across titles, often without realising that’s what they’re doing. Knowing the number makes that instinct deliberate.

## Where the RTP Is Concentrated

A 96.5% RTP means different things depending on where that return is distributed. On a low-volatility title, most of the RTP comes from the base game across thousands of small wins. On a high-volatility title, the base game might contribute 60–70% of the RTP while the bonus round delivers the rest in concentrated bursts.

Worth understanding at any online casino platform. A player running a high-volatility title for fifty base game spins has accessed a fraction of that game’s RTP. The same player who triggers the free spins round twice has accessed a disproportionate share of it.

For Australian online pokies players, knowing where the RTP lives in a specific title changes how the session is structured. High-volatility titles reward patience. Low-volatility ones reward volume.

## Feature Structure and Session Shape

Some titles front-load their features: the base game is packed with wilds, multipliers, and small bonuses that trigger constantly. Others run a lean base game specifically to make the main bonus round feel like a genuine event.

Neither approach is better outright. A player who wants the session to build toward something big will find the second type more rewarding, and a player who wants constant engagement will enjoy the first.

Reading the payable before loading a title answers this question directly. The ratio of base game features to bonus round mechanics tells you what kind of session the game is designed to deliver.

## What to Check Before Loading a Title

A few practical steps that experienced online pokies Australia players tend to follow before committing to a session:

- Check the volatility level and confirm it matches the session goal;
- Look at the hit frequency if listed, or use the payable symbol ratios as a proxy;
- Identify where the RTP is concentrated, base game or bonus round;
- Read the feature structure to understand whether the game builds or sustains;
- Check the max win figure as a signal of how concentrated the top payouts are.

Five minutes spent on these checks tends to produce a much better fit between player and title. The game that feels right is usually the one chosen deliberately.

Usually a volatility or hit frequency mismatch. Checking both figures before loading a title at any Australian online casino largely solves this.

RTP affects long-run return, not session feel. Volatility drives the moment-to-moment rhythm, so both figures matter equally.

### How do I know where a slot's RTP is concentrated?

High-volatility titles almost always concentrate their RTP in the bonus round. The volatility level listed in the game info tab on most online casino Australia platforms signals this directly.

### Can a bonus casino offer change how a slot feels to play?

Yes. Free spins on a high-volatility bonus casino title give access to the part of the game where the RTP is most concentrated, which shifts the session feel considerably.

### Is it worth spending time on the payable before playing?

Absolutely. The payable shows feature structure and bonus mechanics, and five minutes reading it turns a guessing game into an informed session at any Australian online casino.

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## Thoreau and Nature

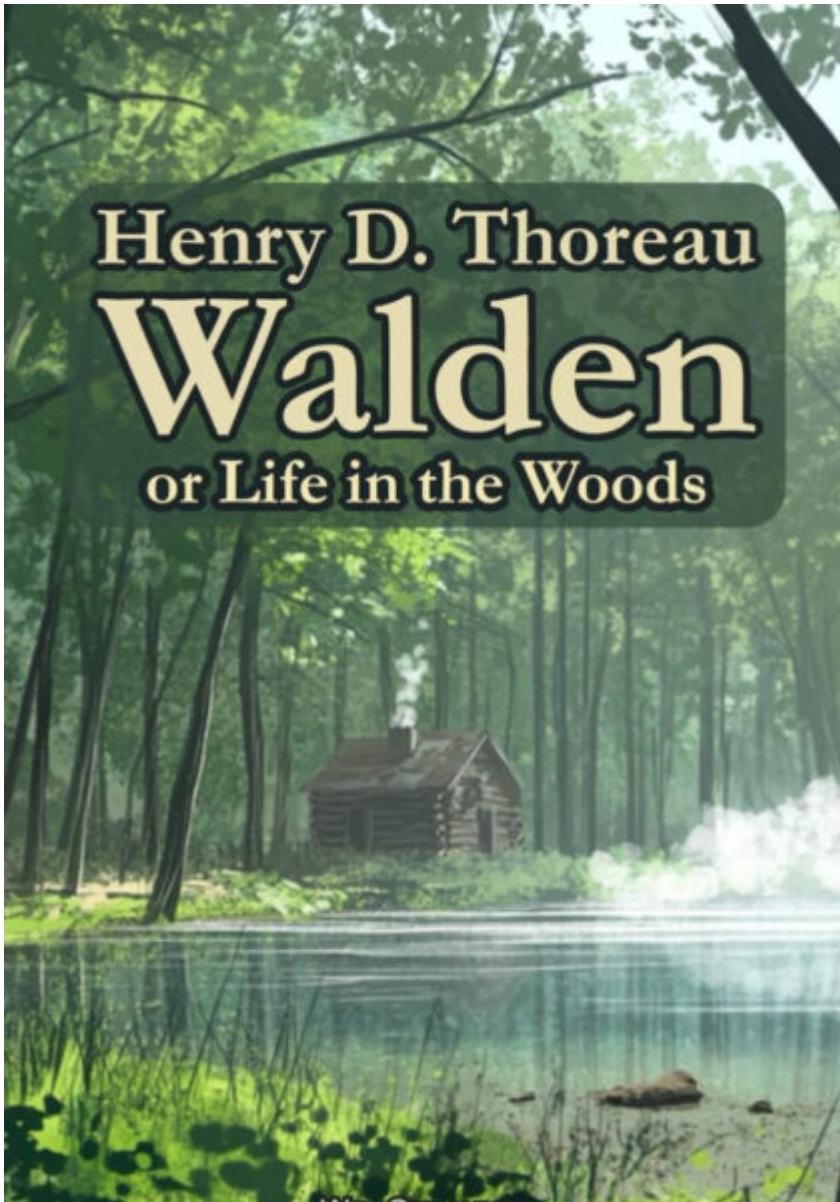


Henry David Thoreau

An American friend told me that in this country they studied [Henry David Thoreau](#) in high school. Having moved to the US from Italy more than 50 years ago, always striving to increase my knowledge of my adoptive land's history and culture, I eventually read *Walden, Or Life in the Woods* in the 1990s.



But it was only a couple of weeks ago, when I watched on PBS the illuminating documentary *Henry David Thoreau*, produced by Ken Burns and Don Henley, that I began to understand the importance of his work and its contemporary significance.



In this slim booklet, *Walden*, Thoreau, born in Concord, Massachusetts in 1817, describes his life during the two year period (1845-1847) that he spent alone by Walden Pond living in a basic cabin that he had built. He supported himself by growing vegetables that he sold at the market and performing chores for the owner of the land, his friend and mentor [Ralph Waldo Emerson](#).



Ralph Waldo Emerson

Emerson, born in 1803, was the leader of the [Transcendentalist movement](#), and described this belief system in his 1836 essay *Nature*.

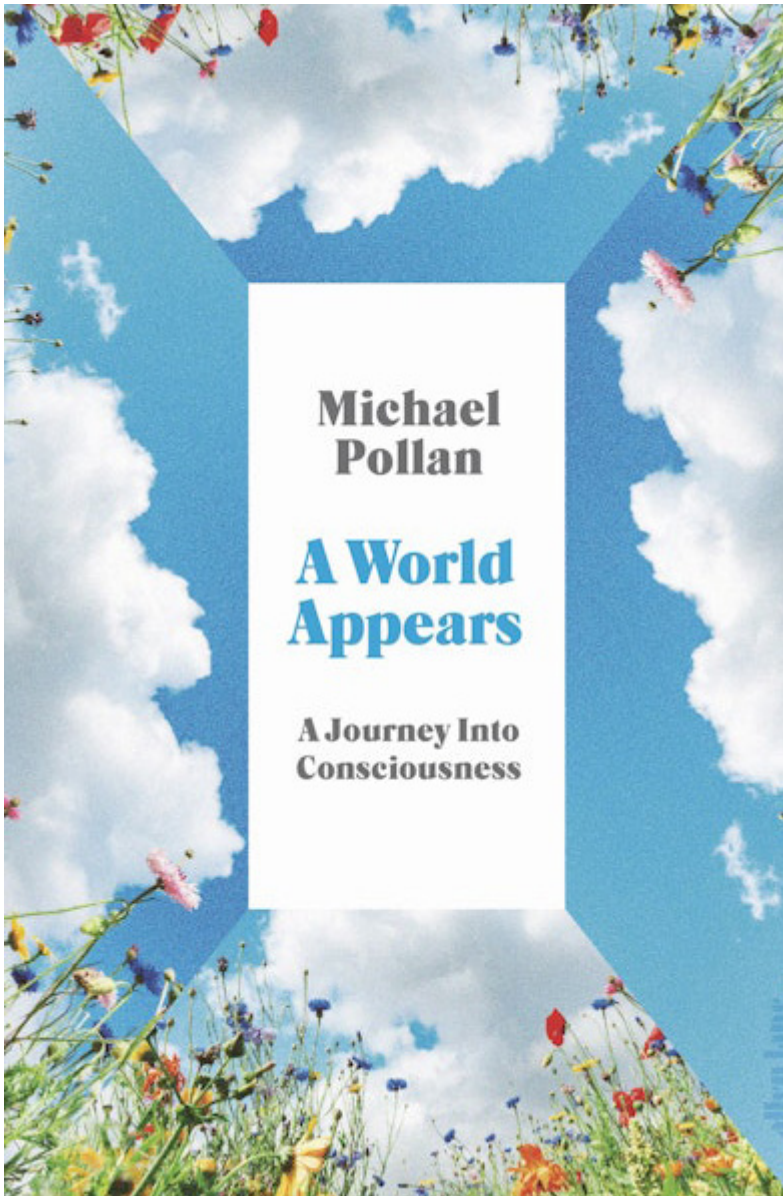


Walt Whitman

Another Emerson's disciple was [Walt Whitman](#), born in 1819, author of the 1855 poetry collection *Leaves of Grass*.

Among the many experts featured in the Thoreau documentary, I was only familiar with two of them. [Bill McKibben](#), author of books about the environment, like *The End of Nature* (1989) about the climate crisis, and [Michael Pollan](#).

I had read all of Pollan's books: *The Botany of Desire* (2001), *The Omnivore's Dilemma* (2006), *In Defense of Food* (2008), *Cooked: A Natural History of Transformation* (2013), *How to Change Your Mind* (2018), *This Is Your Mind on Plants* (2021), and I was already reading his latest, *A World Appears: A Journey into Consciousness* (2026), when I saw the Thoreau documentary.



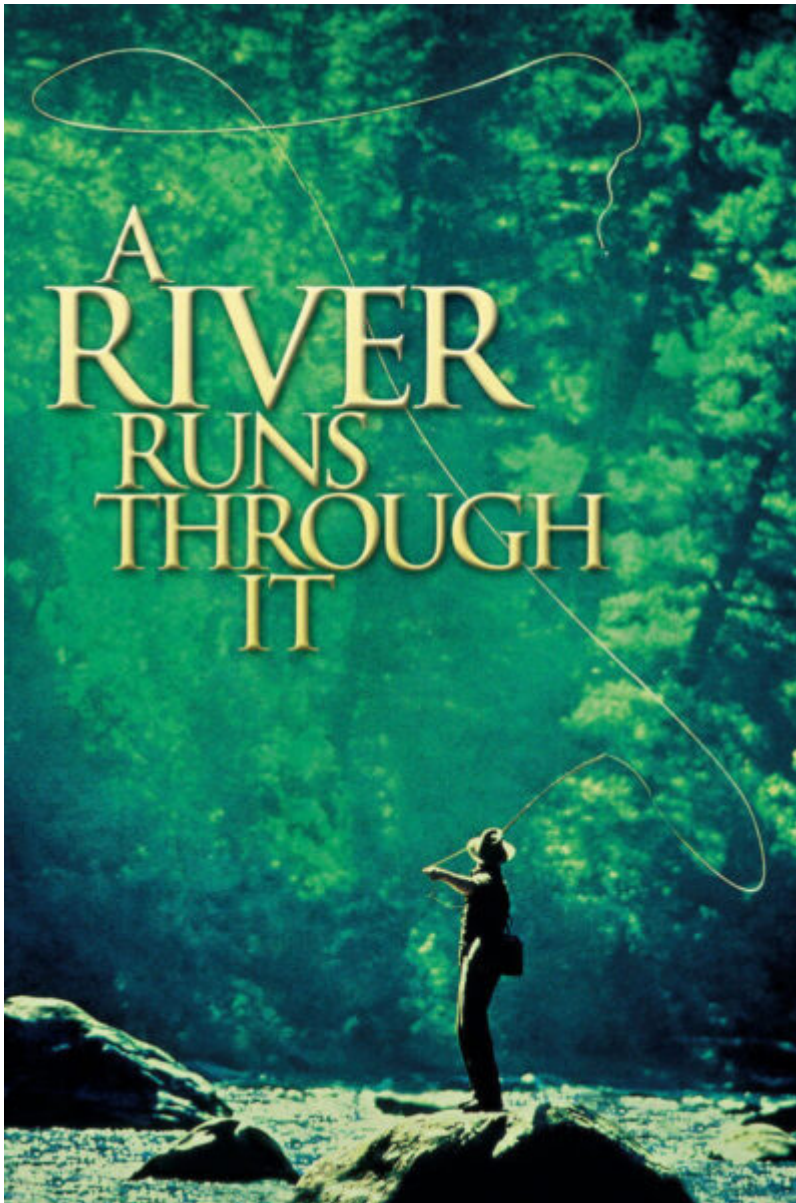
I noticed the synchronicity of these two experiences. Pollan refers to his conviction that plants have, if not a consciousness, a sentience, and mentions the experiments of Italian scientist Monica Gagliano. In 2021 I had interviewed Monica and written a few articles about her work. PLEASE do [read here](#) one published in Cultural Weekly. It seems clear that plants communicate with each other and perhaps with humans as well, through psychedelic trips on [ayahuasca](#) or magic mushrooms.

The connection with Thoreau is that he was meticulously recording in his diary the behavior of plants and animals that he encountered during his daily walks in the woods. He also studied Buddhist beliefs about the relationship between human beings and the natural world, which is not separate from us.

That concept is worth remembering today: animals, plants, oceans, forests, mountains and humans are all part of the same ecosystem and we cannot continue to destroy the environment without threatening our own survival.

I had investigated this idea while researching my book *Robert Redford and the American West*. I realized, while visiting the Sundance Institute, that Redford revered the Native American belief of respecting animals and nature. And so did Thoreau, who spent time in an indigenous people village

in Massachusetts.



It was while watching the TV series *The Madison* (March 14-21) that creator Taylor Sheridan dedicated to [Robert Redford](#), who passed away in 2025, that I was reminded of what Redford said about *A River Runs Through It* (1992). “When you’re fly-fishing, there’s something very powerful and deep about the experience, some real communion with nature that’s totally peaceful and really ancient.”
