Dakota Access and Keystone KL Pipelines

President Trump signed orders reinstating these two controversial projects. *Source: Reuters.* The Dakota Access pipeline has been the site of protests by the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe in North Dakota.

Human Rights

On Friday, the North Dakota legislature will vote on a bill introduced by Rep. Keith Kempenich that would make it legal for car drivers to "accidentally" run over protesters who are on the highway. *Source: CNN*.
