This marks the first season for new artistic director Melissa Barak as **Los Angeles Ballet** opens its 17th season with the *Nutcracker* choreographed by the former co-artistic directors Thordal Christensen and Colleen Neary. Set in 1912 Los Angeles, the production tours metro LA with performances in Glendale, Redondo Beach, Westwood, and Hollywood (with a live orchestra). The approach has proved successful bringing L.A.'s own professional ballet company to its audience rather than expecting folks to fight gridlocked holiday traffic.
