Guest artists from Seattle Washington's **Radost Folk Ensemble** join **Los Angeles Ballet** dancers with live music from the Varimezov Family Band. Since 1976, Radost has toured the northwest presenting the dance, music and song from Eastern Europe including Russia, Ukraine, Bulgaria, Romania, Hungary, Croatia, Macedonia and Bosnia. For the past week Ivan and Tzvetanka

Varimezov have been in residence at LAB. Don't look for pointe shoes as the LAB dancers join in performing eastern European dances for this party. "Radost" translates to "joy" in Slavic languages. Joy may be the goal, but fun is certainly on the menu.
