Choreographer Val Caniparoli is celebrating 50 years with the San Francisco Ballet as choreographer, principal character dancer, teacher and ballet master. **Los Angeles Ballet** offers the SoCal debut of one of the choreographer's most popular full-length ballets, *Lady of the Camellias*. Whether captured in the classic Garbo film *Camille* or in Baz Lurhmann's *Moulin Rouge*, the tragic French romance also has been the subject of several ballets. This version from Caniparoli, set to music by Chopin, has been performed by companies ranging from the Finnish Ballet to Ballet Florida, and now, is here.
