## ***Ulysses*: Bloom at the Top**

The innovative theater collective Elevator Repair Service has tackled such literary giants as Fitzgerald (*Gatz*, its day-long version of *The Great Gatsby*), Faulkner (*The Sound and the Fury*) and Hemingway (*The Sun Also Rises*). The 35-year-old company is now taking on the greatest challenge in its history by bringing to the stage what is generally regarded as one of the most confounding literary masterpieces, James Joyce's *Ulysses*. The 1922 massive tome chronicles a single day—June 16, 1904—in Dublin, following the wanderings of Leopold Bloom, his wife Molly and the young Stephen Dedalus, paralleling Homer's epic *The Odyssey*. Joyce experiments with style and form, switches genres with each chapter and has the characters express their inner thoughts. We are told in an onstage intro that one critic famously said that not much happens in *Ulysses*, apart from everything you can possibly imagine.

Is it even possible to stage such a work which relies so heavily on interior monologues and so little

on plot in theatrical terms? Burgess Meredith directed an adaptation of the phantasmagoric Nightgown section (Bloom venturing into Dublin's red-light district and his own imagination) Off-Broadway in 1958 starring Zero Mostel which was revived on Broadway in 1974. Here director John Collins and co-director Scott Shepherd are taking on the work as a whole, or at least an edited version. While some of the sections are bogged down in attempts to dramatize Joyce's literary excesses and tend to drag, this adaptation does capture the vital energy of the author's vivid characters, his deep themes of sexuality, religion and literature, and the emergence of Dublin itself as a life force.

In his onstage introduction, Shepherd, who also is credited with dramaturgy and playing many roles, explains that Joyce “put so many enigmas and puzzles into *Ulysses* that it would keep the professors busy for centuries arguing about what he meant, and that’s how he would insure his immortality.” Collins and Shepherd make no attempt to unravel those enigmas and puzzles, but present them for us to contemplate and perhaps solve on our own. The cast alternates between narrating the book and enacting the action. They are initially seated at a panel and gradually step out to fully play the scenes. The text is projected onto screens in front of the panel. When they skip over a section, the projected words zip ahead and the actors pretend to fast forward, jerking their bodies as if they were images on sped-up film. This device is amusing the first few times, but grows repetitive.

Fortunately, the majority of Joyce’s narrative is rendered with humor, passion, and imagination. The tables transform into numerous pubs, restaurants and offices and Marika Kent’s lighting and Ben Williams’ sound create each setting with telling details. The cast eat, drink, dream, and fornicate, as an onstage clock notes their progress through the day. By the play’s end the stage is littered with food, papers and other debris and we have experienced much of the human condition including Bloom’s searching for sexual fulfillment and asserting his Jewish identity, Molly’s

sensual exploration of her desires for her husband and other lovers, and Daedalus' yearning for a father figure through literature.

The seven-member cast ably creates a multitude of Dublin denizens, particularly Stephanie Weeks who applies a delightful array of accents and personae. I also enjoyed Kate Benson's scruffy pub crawler and seedy prostitute. Vin Knight gives us a relatable, befuddled and desperate Bloom, searching for identity amid the confusion and fog in Joyce's maze of meaning, stumbling in and out of dreams. Maggie Hoffman subtly and expertly delivers Molly's famous "Yes" monologue which concludes the evening. Shepherd, Dee Beasnael, and Christopher Rashee-Stevenson complete the admirable ensemble.

## Real Money Potential in Big Bass Splash

Big Bass Splash is structured around measurable outcomes. It does not create inflated expectations. Instead, it offers defined mechanics, a capped win ceiling, and a system where the highest returns

are conditional, not random. The game's real money potential exists, but it is not constant. It requires alignment between feature activation, symbol interaction, and retrigger progression.

## Fixed Win Cap and Scalable Payouts

The highest possible payout in **Big Bass Splash** is set at 5,000× the total stake. This is not a theoretical maximum—it is an enforced limit. If this value is reached during the Free Spins feature, the round ends immediately, even if spins remain.

The implications are clear:

- At £0.10 per spin, the maximum payout is £500.
- At £1.00 per spin, it's £5,000.
- At £10.00, it becomes £50,000.
- At the £250 maximum stake (if available), it's £1,250,000.

This structure allows the game to scale rewards with stake level, without modifying the mechanics. The 5,000× cap applies universally. The system does not adjust for bet size in terms of probability. Only the final monetary result changes.

This defined ceiling prevents distortion. It ensures that all players, regardless of stake, are interacting with the same mathematical system.

## Stake Range and Access to Features

Big Bass Splash supports a broad stake range, typically between £0.10 and £250 per spin, although some operators may set different boundaries. The design does not alter based on stake size. The chance of triggering a bonus, landing modifiers, or collecting higher-value fish symbols remains unchanged.

This approach serves two purposes:

- It allows low-stake players to access the full feature set.
- It ensures high-stake players cannot bypass variance by increasing bet size.

The financial outcomes remain scaled. A £0.20 player will not receive £1,000 wins. A £100 player may. But both are operating under the same volatility profile, the same symbol probabilities, and the same feature distribution.

## Feature-Based Value Generation

Base game payouts in Big Bass Splash are not structured to produce large wins. The 10-payline layout with standard symbol values creates minimal fluctuations. The expected outcome from the base game, over time, is limited.

The Free Spins feature contains all major win potential. Three key elements influence its value:

- Fish Symbols with Fixed Values. These appear during Free Spins and carry predefined monetary values based on the current stake. On their own, they do not trigger payouts.
- Fisherman Wilds. These collect the values of visible fish symbols. Each collection event applies the current level's multiplier (e.g., 1×, 2×, 3×).

- Retrigger Mechanic. Every fourth Wild symbol retriggers the feature, adds 10 spins, and increases the multiplier. The progression continues until the 5,000× cap is reached or the bonus ends.

There is no guarantee of any collection event. Fish symbols may appear without Wilds. Wilds may appear on empty reels. When aligned, these elements produce high returns. When misaligned, the bonus may end with minimal payout.

## Role of Modifiers in Payout Expansion

Before each Free Spins round begins, Big Bass Splash may assign 0–5 random modifiers. These include:

- Start from Level 2;
- +2 Extra Spins;
- More Fish Symbols;
- More Wild Symbols;
- More Dynamite Effects (symbol replacement mechanics).

Modifiers affect symbol frequency or bonus structure. They do not influence RTP. They are intended to expand variance—making some bonus rounds more productive than others. If no modifiers appear, the round operates under default rules.

The interaction between modifiers and retriggers defines the upper edge of the game's payout potential. A bonus round with two modifiers and one retrigger can exceed 1,000×. A round without modifiers or retriggers may remain under 20×.

## Win Distribution and Session Behaviour

Big Bass Splash does not create evenly spaced outcomes. The win distribution is skewed. Extended sequences with limited returns are common. They are followed, occasionally, by features that produce a return that offsets several low-result sessions.

For example:

- A 200-spin sequence may result in no feature.
- A 50-spin sequence may contain a bonus that pays 300×.
- Three consecutive bonuses may return under 30×.
- A single retrIGGERED bonus may result in over 1,000×.

This structure defines the risk-reward balance. Players who leave after 50 spins may never encounter the feature. Players who trigger it may still see no gain. The real money value is not in presence—it is in alignment.

## RTP and Real Money Interpretation

The stated RTP of 96.71% does not apply to every session. It is an aggregate return calculated over a high volume of spins. In short-term play, returns may differ significantly.

For example:

- Session A: 300 spins, £100 staked, £40 returned ? RTP: 40%.
- Session B: 120 spins, £30 staked, £180 returned ? RTP: 600%.
- Session C: 50 spins, £10 staked, £8 returned ? RTP: 80%.

All are possible within the same system. The RTP figure only becomes meaningful over thousands of spins. It cannot be used to forecast performance in an individual playing period.

## High-Stakes Potential and Risk Limits

The real money ceiling of £1.25 million (at £250 per spin) exists within a highly restricted probability range. Most players will never approach it. However, outcomes in the range of 500× to 2,000× are structurally achievable, particularly during feature rounds with modifiers and multiple retriggers.

This potential attracts high-stakes players, but the risk is significant. A full balance loss without a feature trigger is entirely possible. The system does not adjust based on prior results. Each spin remains independent.

The risk level is static. The volatility does not adjust in real-time. Session variance is inherent in the design.

## Conclusion

Big Bass Splash does not simulate potential. It defines it. The 5,000× cap is constant. The stake range is fixed. The features are deterministic. Modifiers are randomly assigned, but not manipulated. All players interact with the same mechanics.

Real money gains are not delivered by chance alone—they require a specific interaction of symbol appearance, feature timing, and retrigger progress. There are no shortcuts, no hidden systems, and no dynamic adjustments.

For players seeking clear rules, fixed limits, and scaled opportunity, Big Bass Splash presents a measurable system. It does not reward every session. But when conditions align, the game allows for results that exceed baseline expectations by a wide margin.

The potential is not abstract. It is written into the structure. The game pays when its systems connect—not before.

# Strategies and Payouts in Chicken Royal

Chicken Royal is a timing-based arcade survival game where players control chickens as they try to cross roads without being hit. While it may look light-hearted, every run depends on focus, quick decision-making, and consistency. There are no formal “payouts” in the gambling sense, but the game does have internal rewards, progression systems, and practical ways to optimize coin gains and performance. This guide breaks down the key strategies used to improve results, along with how the coin economy functions—what you earn, how to earn it faster, and how it fits into the overall experience.

## Smart Movement Strategies in Chicken Royal

The core of **Chicken Royal** is about how you move—every decision, swipe, or press must align with the behaviour of traffic. The game doesn’t include complex power-ups or combat, so the strategy lies in reading patterns, managing rhythm, and minimising unnecessary risk.

To perform consistently, players often follow a set of habits. These aren’t special moves or hidden tricks. They’re behavioural patterns developed through trial and error.

Before listing specific strategies, it’s important to note that each round is short. You do not need long-term tactics. You need sharp, practical habits that survive for 30–90 seconds.

Effective strategies for surviving longer in Chicken Royal:

- Wait and read: Don’t rush. Let a few vehicles pass to identify the current pattern.
- One move at a time: Avoid double-tapping or panicking. Every movement should be deliberate.
- Diagonal escape only when necessary: Use angle shifts only when forward is blocked, not as a default.
- Know vehicle types: Trucks are slower but wide. Cars are fast but more frequent. Recognition helps.
- Reset rhythm after bonuses: Bonus pickups can interrupt your tempo—take a moment to re-centre.
- Use solo mode for practice: Before entering Battle Royale rounds, solo runs let you build rhythm safely.

Applying these strategies can improve your average session length, which is directly tied to coin earning and leaderboard ranking. The game doesn’t reward aggressive risk-taking. It rewards caution, timing, and momentum.

## Multiplayer Tactics: Chicken Royal Battle Royale Mode

The Battle Royale mode changes the objective slightly. Instead of just staying alive, you need to survive longer than every other chicken in the match. The rules stay the same, but the pressure increases—every move is now comparative.

In multiplayer, players often make avoidable mistakes because of visibility. Other chickens create distraction. You may follow them instinctively or assume a path is safe when it’s not. Success in this mode comes down to managing your own plan while ignoring outside noise.

Battle Royale tactics to increase survival chances:

- Don't follow others: Their rhythm might not suit the timing of your own movement.
- Let the crowd thin: Avoid action in the first 10 seconds and let others eliminate themselves.
- Play in the edge lanes: Side areas have fewer players, giving more space to focus.
- Avoid flashy skins: Bright avatars make you easier to track and distract other players, drawing unnecessary chaos.
- Switch between modes: Alternate solo and multiplayer to maintain sharpness without burnout.

This mode increases tension, which leads to shorter rounds for most players. Winning consistently here is possible, but it requires sharp psychological control. There are no gameplay advantages given to experienced users—it's all about how well you can hold your pace.

## Coin Payouts: Earning and Spending Wisely

There are no real-money payouts in Chicken Royal, and no gambling features. The game has its own virtual coin system, which functions as a soft currency. Coins are used to unlock visual customisation, light enhancements, and optional perks that affect convenience, not outcome.

You cannot withdraw anything from the game, and you do not place bets. Coins are either earned through play or bought through the in-game store.

Ways to earn coins in Chicken Royal:

- Distance survived: The longer your run, the higher your coin return.
- Bonus pickups: Scattered throughout rounds; these offer extra coins if collected safely.
- Leaderboard placement: Event-based challenges may provide coin rewards for top scorers.
- Session streaks: Consistent play without failure earns small cumulative bonuses.
- Watching optional ads: Available on mobile versions, limited per day.

You don't need to pay to earn coins. However, coin purchases exist for players who prefer to unlock content faster or skip early grinding.

Coin value is fixed. There are no price spikes or manipulative bundles. This makes the system transparent and easy to navigate.

## Spending Coins: What's Worth Unlocking?

Not every unlock in Chicken Royal will suit every player. Some upgrades offer visual variation, while others bring slight changes to pacing or restart behaviour. No upgrade will guarantee survival. You must still play well to win.

Choosing wisely helps stretch your coins, especially if you're playing without purchasing extras. Recommended coin purchases for gameplay efficiency:

- Quick restart feature: Removes time delays between deaths and new rounds.
- First-second shield: Helps avoid early mistakes in the first few moves.
- Custom skin with high visibility: Useful if you want to track your movement easily on crowded screens.
- Environmental themes with high contrast: Some themes make vehicle edges more readable.

Purely cosmetic items (like novelty chickens or visual effects) are a matter of taste. They do not affect difficulty but may improve your focus or motivation. For many players, visual change keeps the game fresh.

The upgrade system is not deep. It's intentionally limited to maintain fairness. Once you've made a few useful purchases, the remaining unlocks are optional.

## Conclusion

In Chicken Royal, every reward is tied to gameplay. There's no chance-based reward structure. There's no staking of coins or entry fees that promise a return. Winning is not luck-based. The payouts—meaning coins, leaderboard scores, and performance improvements—are a direct result of strategic play.

Players who develop habits around timing, patience, and movement control earn more, survive longer, and unlock features faster. Those who approach the game aggressively tend to reset more often and gain coins slower.

To summarise:

- Strategy in Chicken Royal is mechanical, not financial.
- Coins are earned by performance, not betting.
- Spending coins wisely enhances consistency.
- Battle Royale success comes from personal control, not following others.
- The payout structure respects skill and discipline.

The game rewards mastery, not experimentation. It does not adapt to you—you adapt to it. That's what makes its structure remain relevant even years after release.

In 1995, about *The Quick and the Dead* by Sam Raimi, *The Basketball Diaries*, *Total Eclipse* by Agnieszka Holland

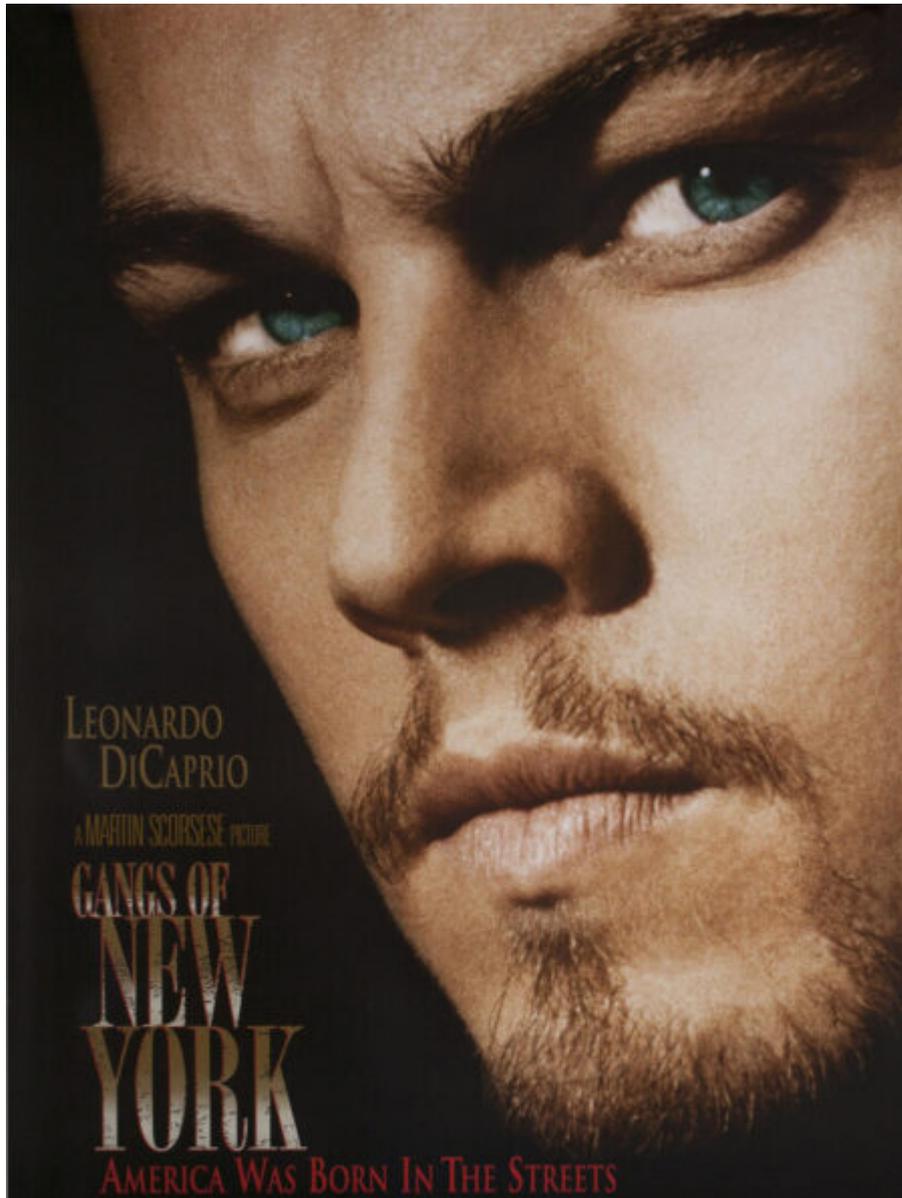

In 2015, I wrote for Best Movie an interview with DiCaprio about *The Revenant* by Alejandro Gonzales Iñárritu.

In 2019, I interviewed DiCaprio about *Once Upon a Time in Hollywood* written and directed by Quentin Tarantino, wrote a long text for Voilà, the Italian bimonthly.

In 2021, I wrote for Voilà what DiCaprio said about his efforts to protect the environment. This was the intro:

Leonardo DiCaprio started acting as a teenager and became a movie star at 22 with the success of *Titanic* (1997) directed by James Cameron. He established the Leonardo DiCaprio Foundation in 1998 to promote environmental awareness, produced and narrated documentaries like *The 11th Hour* (2007) about the environmental crisis and a sustainable future, *Before the Flood* (2016) directed by Fisher Stevens about climate change, *Ice on Fire* (2019) about global warming.



What were your intentions when you produced and narrated the documentary *The 11th Hour*?

“I used to think of the environmental movement as a small group of people trying to change the world, but this is really a gigantic worldwide movement; there are so many people that have devoted their lives to this issue doing so many different things around the world. We don’t even need to look towards the future, we can reduce the human imprint on Planet Earth by 90% with the technologies that we have readily available, that already exist. It’s just about making sure these are implemented into our daily lives, and we have to urge our corporations and our governments to do that. So when we start thinking in that realm, it’s pretty hopeful and inspiring, because the realities of what will go on with business as usual is pretty scary and depressing. That’s why we made that movie, to make sure more people became more aware of these issues.”

You produced other documentaries about global warming and the climate crisis since that first one, what are your goals?

“It boils down to public awareness, because no corporation is going to do anything to change or make our planet a better place, unless the public demands it from them. And our government isn’t going to implement any kind of change, unless we vote for the right leaders and demand that these things happen. So it’s about giving this issue the proper publicity and urgency in the public eye, so that we, as a global community, are more aware and demand that change happens.”

How would you define the responsibilities of the governments and their leaders?

“I believe that the governments of the world are there to serve the people, so, first off, they have to adhere to the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, with everyone curbing some of these emissions. China and the United States are the leading super powers that are contributing the most to this problem, we’re huge industrialized nations that produce a lot of waste. So we need to be the ones to set an example, and this generation needs to know that their actions today are going to shape what happens in the future.”

In 2017 DiCaprio disclosed that he met with Donald Trump after he was elected President in November 2016.

“We presented him with a comprehensive plan to tackle climate change, while also simultaneously harnessing the economic potential of green jobs. We talked about how the United States has the potential to lead the world in clean-energy manufacturing, research and development. We should not have people in office who do not believe in facts, truths and modern science, who are able to manipulate and risk the future of this entire generation.”



In October 2025, DiCaprio posted on his Instagram:

“Donald Trump continues to deny the facts and the science. He withdrew the United States from the Paris Climate Accords and rolled back critical environmental protections. Now he’s promised the oil and gas industry that he’ll get rid of any regulation they want in exchange for a billion-dollar donation. Climate change is killing the earth and ruining our economy. We need a bold step forward to save our economy, our planet and ourselves. That’s why I’m voting for Kamala Harris.”
