Top 5 Must-Play First-Person Shooter Games for PC

The first-person shooter (FPS) is one of the most popular genres in the video game industry for gamers across all generations. FPS games are great for people who love the thrill of shooting and getting lost in a virtual conflict. They test “gaming instincts” and let you show off your quick reactions, your awareness of your surroundings, and how well you can work with your team. If you are one of those who want to give a try to FPS products, then here is a list of the 10 best first-person shooter games you can play right now. You won’t find the most important FPS games in history here. Instead, this list will feature the games that players who are new to the genre will definitely like.

Destiny 2

Millions of people have stuck with the FPS MMO that Bungie made. Destiny 2 players are happy to do the same tasks over and over again to get the best gear. This shows how skilled the developers who made Halo are at making guns that feel great. It can be tough for new players to catch up to more experienced ones, but if you’re a new player, don’t worry about it too much. There’s a **Destiny 2 carry** service. Thanks to it, you can easily complete the Pantheon challenge and get a Flawless run in Trials of Osiris.

Overwatch 2

Overwatch 2 has a good mix of heroes and game types to play with thanks to seasonal updates. The game features a shared environment for player-versus-player (PvP) modes and initially planned to introduce persistent cooperative modes, although these plans were later scrapped in 2023, focusing the game on its PvP elements. Notably, Overwatch 2 is free-to-play on multiple platforms and has received updates and new content since its release, including the addition of new heroes, game modes, maps, and story-based offerings.

Hunt: Showdown

Hunt: Showdown is our favorite new extraction shooter game. Instead of battle royale, it has a PvPvE mode where hunters fight zombies, bug assassins, underwater tentacle monsters, and other hunters. Its setting in an American swamp in the 19th century is unique, and its surprising collection of early guns goes well with it. We think it’s one of the best online games out there right now and the best free-to-play Western FPS we’ve ever played.

Halo Infinite

While 343 Industries works hard on new Halo games, Halo Infinite is on the rise. A string of popular changes to the game have made it easier to customize, added AI to Forge, and added a co-op Firefight mode. There are a lot of playlist choices in multiplayer, the range of maps is finally good enough, the challenge system is almost perfect, and Infinite's combat is still great. There are also more players, about 487 thousand monthly, which suggests that it's not just me who plays Big Team Battle every night after work. There are still a lot of real complaints in the community, but a Halo game that runs like butter still gets pretty good marks.

Deep Rock Galactic

We're seeing a rise in co-op first-person shooters, and Deep Rock is a great example of this. Ghost Ship Games did almost everything right. Deep Rock has some of the best first-person shooter gameplay out there, even though it looks very low-poly. Its procedurally produced tasks can be played over and over again because each of the four classes has very different skills and a different path to progress. Since mining is an important part of tasks, the best co-op moments usually involve both killing bugs and setting up a clutch zipline or platform to reach an ore seam that is in a dangerous place.

The first-person shooter genre has remained a cornerstone of gaming, offering thrilling experiences for players of all skill levels. Whether you're diving into the rich lore of Destiny 2, battling it out in Overwatch 2's dynamic arenas, or delving into the eerie swamps of Hunt: Showdown, there's something for everyone. With titles like Halo Infinite and Deep Rock Galactic pushing boundaries, the future of FPS gaming on PC looks brighter than ever.
