- Benedictine dip with veggies or crackers

- Fried chicken or chicken tenders with honey mustard
- Derby pie (chocolate, pecans, bourbon—yes, it's a thing!)

Set everything up buffet-style with racing-themed labels for a polished look.

# 4. Host Your Own Betting Pool

A little friendly wagering adds excitement to the race. You don't need a betting app to join the action:

- Print out the official field from KentuckyDerby.com the morning of the race.
