If comfort is your goal, then you'll want to look out for these sofa features:

- Rounded armrests you can easily lean against
- Soft fabric that feels good to the touch
- Supportive foam and batting OR feathers

What are the Most Comfortable Sofa Materials?

The last thing to consider when choosing or even building a sofa of your own (through a brand's options) is the material. In general you want the material to feel good against your skin, be hard-wearing, and, most of all, be easy to care for:

- **Cotton:** Natural, breathable, and easy to clean, though spot treatments may be less effective.
- **Linen:** Breathable, warm in winter, cool in summer, easy to care for, can wrinkle
- **Polyester:** Easy to clean, can feel good to the touch, but not breathable.
- **Leather:** Luxury finish, long-lasting, does require extra care and cannot be washed.

If you have skin sensitivities, then you need a natural, breathable material **like linen or cotton**. If you want luxury, choose leather. If you're after something more budget, choose a thicker polyester or man-made material finish (like corduroy or boucle) since these hold up better than woven fabrics in the long run.

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
