Natrava at a glance

SuperBeets Heart Chews at a glance

SuperBeets Heart Chews from HumanN are the bigger, more established name, and the Zero Sugar variant carries no sugar at all. They pair 500 mg of beet root powder with 150 mg of grape seed

extract. The brand also cites its own clinical study, which we cover below.

Ingredient Comparison: Beet Root, Grape Seed, & Vitamins

Both products share the same engine, beet-derived nitrate plus grape seed extract, but the forms and the third ingredient differ. That is where the formulas split. The detail matters more than the marketing.

Natrava: beet root extract, grape seed extract, vitamin C

Natrava uses 350 mg of a concentrated 20:1 beet root extract, derived from 7,000 mg of whole beet root. Its grape seed extract is listed as 11.5 mg of a 13:1 extract, equal to 150 mg of grape seed extract, which aligns with clinically studied levels. It rounds out the formula with 45 mg of vitamin C for antioxidant support.

SuperBeets: beet root powder, grape seed extract, magnesium

SuperBeets uses 500 mg of beet root powder rather than a concentrated extract, plus 150 mg of grape seed extract, the same clinically studied level Healthline ties to blood-pressure support. Its third ingredient is magnesium instead of vitamin C. Both deliver comparable grape seed, so the real difference is the beet form and that third ingredient.

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MilkyWay Provider: Best Games and Games Island Access Model

There's something worth understanding about how digital entertainment platforms actually reach operators: most of the infrastructure is invisible to the end user. The game loads, the credits work, the admin panel functions, and the entire distribution chain behind all of that stays behind a curtain most players never think about. Milky Way 777 is a platform where the supply chain tells a genuinely interesting story, partly because of its positioning within a specific network and partly because of what the catalog itself contains across four distinct game formats. This piece explains how the operator side of that ecosystem works, what the MilkyWay provider catalog offers, and why the network context matters for operators evaluating whether to add it.

How Platform Networks Shape Operator Decisions

Most sweepstakes gaming operators don't run a single platform. They run a portfolio, multiple platforms under one operator account, each serving slightly different player segments or session preferences. The decision about which platforms to add isn't just about individual catalogs. It's about which platforms share infrastructure, credit pricing tiers, or distribution networks in ways that reduce the overhead of running multiple options simultaneously.

Milky Way 777 and OrionStars operate on the same platform network and share the same credit pricing tier. For operators who already run OrionStars, adding Milky Way 777 doesn't require a separate supply chain relationship or a new account manager contact. That network relationship is the specific operational context that makes **GamesIslands** relevant here. As the verified B2B vendor for both platforms, Games Island services operator accounts at the master distributor and agent level for the entire OrionStars network tier, with direct familiarity with how each platform's catalog differs from the other.

What the Milky Way Provider Catalog Actually Contains

Forty-plus games across four categories is the headline. Breaking it down makes the catalog more useful to evaluate. The **MilkyWay provider** page on Games Island lists the confirmed game library: 14-plus fish table titles led by Raging Kingdom, Eagle Strike, Volcamon Strike, Fire Kirin Plus, and Panda vs. Alien; 21-plus slot titles including Shooting Star, Lucky Duck, 888 Fortune Gold, 4th of July, and Vegas Hits; 4-plus keno titles including Super Ball Keno, Hexa Keno, and Super Keno; and other formats including Blackjack 21 and Air Strike Plus.

Operator accounts and wholesale credits are delivered instantly after payment confirmation. The platform runs at milkywayapp.xyz on any web browser alongside dedicated Android and iOS apps at the same address. The admin backend, covering credit management, sub-account creation, and agent hierarchy controls, is identical for a single game room operator and a master distributor running multiple agent locations. Account level determines what each user can create below them. The software itself doesn't change.

Top Five Games Worth Knowing in the Milky Way Catalog

Raging Kingdom

Raging Kingdom is the fish arcade title that defines Milky Way 777's catalog identity in the same way Wild Dragon defines Vegas X's. The setting places players in an underwater kingdom where boss creatures appear at intervals, carrying significantly higher multipliers than standard targets. Sustained coordinated fire on those boss creatures produces the best returns per session, which is the tactical habit that experienced fish arcade players transfer immediately from other platforms. Raging Kingdom is the title operators most often cite when explaining why they added Milky Way 777 specifically, rather than a competing fish-table platform.

Eagle Strike

Eagle Strike moves the fish-arcade format into an aerial environment, changing the targeting dynamic in ways that catch new players off guard. Targets move faster and at less predictable angles than underwater fish in standard arcade formats. The instinct to focus fire on the largest targets on screen, which works reasonably well in most fish games, produces less consistent results here because the largest aerial targets don't always carry the highest multipliers. Eagle Strike rewards players who spend their first session learning the specific target-value distribution rather

than applying habits from other titles.

Shooting Star

Shooting Star is Milky Way 777's standout slot title and the clearest example of the platform's in-house slot design sensibility. A celestial theme with sharp visual presentation, scatter-triggered free spin mechanics, and a bonus round that can produce meaningfully different outcomes from one trigger to the next. For operators comparing Milky Way 777's slot catalog against the licensed-content slot catalogs of platforms like Vegas X, Shooting Star is the title that establishes Milky Way 777's own slot identity rather than leaning on publisher recognition.

Super Ball Keno

Super Ball Keno is the keno format that consistently receives the most operator attention in Milky Way 777's catalog, specifically because it gives players an active selection before each draw. Players choose their own number set rather than receiving a randomly assigned grid, introducing a decision layer that extends session engagement beyond the purely passive observation required by standard keno formats. The super ball mechanic applies a multiplier to any matched number that falls in the super ball position, creating outcome variance within a single draw and keeping repeat sessions from feeling identical.

Blackjack 21

Blackjack 21 is the platform's table-game entry and the format most likely to attract players who find both fish arcade and slot play overly reliant on luck rather than skill. Standard blackjack rules apply: beat the dealer's hand without exceeding 21, with decisions on every hand determining how the session unfolds. On mobile at milkywayapp.xyz, the card interface renders clearly on a phone screen without requiring the zoom-and-scroll navigation that some tablet-optimized table games produce on smaller displays. For operators whose player base includes anyone with card-game experience, Blackjack 21 extends the platform's reach into a demographic that neither fish tables nor slots alone can capture.

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Uneven *Henry VI*

What a difference a day makes. The first part of NAATCO (National Asian-American Theater Company) and the Public Theater's two-evening presentation of Shakespeare's *Henry VI* trilogy is a confusing muddle with ridiculously labyrinthine plots and melodramatic acting and direction. I actually dreaded returning to the Public the following evening for the second part. But, much to my relief and delight, Part Two was a tighter, ferocious spectacle of power politics. The press materials claims this early work from the Bard inspired the bloodthirsty *Game of Thrones* fantasy series and the second part bears that out. Originally presented in 2018, *Henry VI: A Trilogy in Two Parts* condenses three of the Bard's early history plays in a two-night sprawling epic. The action covers the seemingly endless War of the Roses wherein the Houses of York and Lancaster battle for the crown during the reign of the boyishly naive title monarch.

Director and Adapter Stephen Brown-Fried can do little to enliven the overstuffed Part One, subtitled Foreign Wars. The young king (sensitive Jon Norman Schneider) is embroiled in armed conflict to retain the French lands conquered by his father the war-like Henry V. The French have a secret weapon, the possibly divine, possibly witchy Joan of Arc (fiery Myka Cue). Meanwhile, the devious Duke of York (steely Rajesh Bose) is scheming to seize the throne, countered by Henry's dominant wife Queen Margaret (commanding Teresa Avia Lim). There are so many slow-motion battles, reversals of fortune and elaborate stratagems, it's nearly impossible to keep track of them all. (Mextly Couzin's striking lighting does help clarify the action somewhat.) In one ironic scene, York's convoluted explanation for his claim to the crown gets the biggest laugh of the evening.

Actors are constantly moving pylons entwined with thick ropes back and forth across the drab set by the design team of dots. The absurd black and white costumes by threeAsFour featuring weird puffy fabric choices, denote no specific period and make the performers look like they are wearing sleeping bags or comforters. Hardly appropriate for combat. Mia Katigbak does have moments of dignified grace as Henry's humane advisor, an island of sanity in a sea of madness. (There are many interesting examples of cross-gender casting with women playing male roles.)

But Part Two, subtitled Civil Strife, benefits from mainly focusing on a single story arc: the machiavellian machinations of the crippled, satanic Duke of Gloucester, later to be crowned the infamous Richard III. Played like a diminutive dynamo demon by Julyana Soelistyo, Richard becomes the center of an epic battle to seize the monarchy at all costs. Brown-Fried's pacing becomes quicker and clearer, the battles are not as repetitive and the acting is sharper. Schneider's Henry grows more complex, displaying the woebegone king's conflicting inner struggle between religious idealism and brutal reality. (In a fascinating double-casting choice, he reappears as a

lowly messenger after the king has been taken captive.) Lim's Margaret emerges as a wolf-like predator, devouring anyone who crosses her. A production of *Richard III* featuring Soelistyo and Lim would be a terrific cage match. There are also vibrant performances in this second part by Anna Ishida as Warwick, Orville Mendoza as the rebel Jack Cade, and David Lee Huynh as Clifford.

The three *Henry VI* plays are rarely performed, yet they have relevance in today's world. Both feature a deeply divided country with leaders exploiting populist fears and passions to gain unchecked power. This production attempts to make that connection, but only succeeds half-way.

It had been several years since I visited the [Autry Museum](#) of the American West in Griffith Park, so when I read that they opened a new exhibition, *Life, Liberty, and Los Angeles* (May 30, 2026-January 31, 2027), I decided to drive there to explore it.

The image chosen to best represent L.A. culture and lifestyle is a red automobile (actually a foldable toy), *Carro con Corazon (Rojo)*, designed by [Frank Romero](#) in 1987.

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Why Real Murano Glass Still Matters Today

Is Murano glass still valued today/ And how important is its authenticity? Millions of people visit Murano Island every year in search of coveted Murano Glass, and its authenticity is very important today because, in a world of mass-produced goods, it is one of the last strongholds of handmade luxury.

Real Murano glass represents centuries of tradition, with techniques being passed down through the generations. The techniques are so intricate and specialized that they can take an aspiring glassmaker around 15 years to master.

In modern times, Murano glass artisans fight against mass-produced glass, integrating cutting-edge methods with traditional techniques, ensuring that every piece they create is one-of-a-kind.

The Masters Who Made Murano Glass Famous

The history of genuine Murano glass is defined by the figures who raised the concept of Venetian glass from the practical to the artistic. Since the 15th century, artisans have been inventing new techniques and reconstructing and redeveloping ancient methods of producing glass. By the 20th century, Murano glass had turned into the perfect blend of new artistic ideas with traditional techniques.

One of the most famous artisans of the Renaissance was Angelo Barovier. He invented Cristallo glass – a revolutionary concept then – a way to create clear, transparent glass. He and other masters then used it to make very thin glass for chalices and goblets, and many still use essentially the same technique today to make wine glasses and decanters. Barovier is famous for creating the Barovier cup, a wedding gift made from deep-blue glass and then hand-painted and gilded. Replicas are still being made in the same way as the original.

In the 19th century, after a lull in the production of Murano glass, Vincenzo Moretti revived ancient techniques and perfected the method of Millefiori, known in Italian as Murrina, a decorative technique in which multicolored patterns are created inside a glass cane. This is then sliced and incorporated into blown-glass artwork.

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Antonio Salviati was another famous name in 19th-century Murano glass-making. Originally a lawyer, he established glassworks to produce colorful glass enamel mosaics to restore the interior of Basilica di San Marco and other Venetian churches. The glassworks became a successful business, and to this day there is never any shortage of requests for mosaics for the restoration of iconic Venetian sites. Salviati's company then worked on reinventing ancient techniques, such as Chalcedony. He is credited as a major figure in the revival of the Murano glass industry in the 1850s.

When talking about Murano glass, one cannot avoid coming across Paolo Venini, one of the most important Italian artisans of the 20th century. Through collaborations with other artisans and architects, he broke away from traditional designs and introduced objects featuring contemporary geometric and minimalist shapes.

Fulvio Bianconi inserted playfulness, vivid colors, and abstraction into traditional Murano glassmaking. He created whimsical and colorful pieces, such as his 'Commedia del Arte' figures, as well as the Fazzoletto, or handkerchief, vases, and Pezzati, or patchwork vases. For some time, he was in partnership with Paolo Venini.

Carlo Scarpa was a talented architect and designer who worked with Venini in the 1930s and 1940s. He experimented with thick, layered, and etched glass.

Current Trends in Murano Glass

Real Murano glass blends Venetian traditions and craftsmanship with contemporary ideas. There has been a move away from heavy, overly ornate and gilded designs towards fluid curves and asymmetrical shapes, in bold colors and simplistic patterns, often designed to be striking centerpieces.

Colors have moved toward soft tints such as milky white, smoke, and monochromatic clear glass, or evolved into rich, bold palettes. The former blends easily with contemporary minimalist interiors, while the latter creates a focus and a center of attention in a room that otherwise features relatively bland colors. Sometimes, the role of blown Murano glass in the room is to offset other interior decor aspects, such as features made of granite, marble, or wood. This creates an interesting contrast between textures and makes space more sophisticated.

Vintage lighting has been revived, and there has been a return to popular chandelier styles of the centuries past. Murano glass chandeliers in floral shapes and beautiful colors are again trendy, and people pick them out for their rich artistic heritage and versatility both as a light source and a focus of interior design. Modern takes on traditional Murano chandeliers are also popular, with irregular and asymmetrical, sometimes sculptural, shapes and unusual colors.

Customization is in demand as people are searching for items that are personal to them and different from what anyone else has. Customization options include personalized colors and designs, as well as customized shapes. Traditional techniques are still used, but with the customer's vision included.

Contemporary Masters

Contemporary glass artisans blend ancient techniques with modern ideas, and many of them are **influenced by Italian masters** and Murano glassmaking trends. For example, a well-known name to all contemporary glass artists around the world is Lino Tagliapietra. Born in Murano, Lino Tagliapietra is one of the most celebrated modern maestros, widely admired for his technical skills. He became a glass apprentice at the age of 11 and has worked in glass for over 70 years, spending half of his time in Murano and the other half in the U. S. Tagliapietra is famous for pioneering unique, fluid shapes and for creating

gravity-defying installations. The Dinosaur is composed of precarious, elongated vessels with a narrow base, while the Angel Tear is an elongated teardrop shape. He has also produced two-dimensional glass 'paintings' and blown glass fleets that experiment with movement and light.

Davide Salvadore, born in 1953, is famous for creating bold, rhythmic shapes in vibrant colors. He often fuses traditional techniques such as incalmo, which is the joining of two or more pieces of blown glass to make one piece, with organic contemporary designs.

Oscar Zanetti was born in Murano in 1961 and started working with glass at the age of 14. He worked in some of the most renowned glass factories, such as Venini and Barovier & Toso. Since 1993, he has organized glass exhibitions and has exhibited his works at the Venezia Aperto Vetro (Venice Open Glass) exhibition as well as other local and international art glass events.

Simone Cenedese is a renowned Murano artisan, based in Venice. He runs the glassworks his father opened in the 1970s. He is especially known for his contemporary interpretations of classic

chandeliers and for abstract sculptures. He likes to use the technique, *Sommerso*, to layer colors for dramatic effect. His glassworks create pieces for both public and private spaces throughout the world.

Where To See Murano Glass Art in Venice

To learn more about the look and feel of real Murano glass, it's good to see it up close. This is possible at exhibitions, which keep the art form alive for generations and allow people to familiarize themselves with authentic Murano glass and distinguish it from fakes that are flooding both the high and low ends of the market.

Le Stanze del Vetro

Le Stanze del Vetro (The Glass Rooms) is an exhibition space on the island of San Giorgio Maggiore, a small island in Venice opposite St. Mark's Square. It hosts various thematic exhibitions on the subject of the rich history of Murano glass in Venice. The current exhibition, "1948 – 1958 Murano Glass and the Biennale: A Decade of Wonders," celebrates the decade of 1948 to 1958 when glass exhibitions were resumed at the Venice Biennale and the Venetian pavilion. On display are over 180 pieces from historic glassmakers, including Paolo Venini, Barovier & Toso with Ercole Barovier, Aureliano Toso with Dino Martens, and Seguso Vetri d'Arte with Flavio Poli. This decade was a time when centuries-old techniques were reinvented, and there were new experiments in glassmaking.

Lost in a Glass of Water

Lost in a Glass of Water runs until June 21st, 2026, at the Palazzo Barovier & Toso in Murano. It is an exhibition created by video artist Fabrizio Plessi, and it explores glass through video and installations. Through this medium, traditional Murano bottles and glasses are filled with liquid. Their movements dictate the shape of the glass, which appears distorted. Practical functions become rhythmic, with light and movement highlighting the properties of liquid and glass.

Murano Glass Festival

The Murano Glass Festival is held every June in Murano. Here you can see live glassblowing demonstrations by master artisans. There are also exhibitions of both classical and contemporary glass.

Venice Glass Week

Venice Glass Week is held every year in September and is bigger and more popular than the Murano Glass Festival. For one week, Murano, Venice, and Mestre host many exhibitions, installations, live demonstrations, and meetings with master artisans.

Murano illumina il mondo (Murano Lights Up the World)

In the winter, chandeliers and light installations created by master glassmakers are placed in St. Mark's Square in Venice, transforming a dismal winter's night into a spectacle of reflection and light, highlighting the skill of Murano maestros.

Real Murano glass is still very important in contemporary times. So many products are mass-

produced, including glass, and often have no character. Authentic Murano glass is the opposite and is a piece of handmade luxury that we can still enjoy today. Cultural heritage is being protected while integrating modern twists, making it relevant for today's audience.

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Former Bachelor Producer Bennett Graebner on Hallmark's Reality TV Pivot

Hallmark's overall ratings fell 24% in 2025 alongside the rest of cable. The network still produced and aired every one of the year's Top 50 most-watched cable movies among women 18 and older and among all households.

Its biggest title of the year wasn't a Christmas film. An Unexpected Valentine, a February romance starring Lacey Chabert and Robert Buckley, drew 1.8 million viewers to top the slate. Meanwhile, Finding Mr. Christmas, the network's reality competition that crowns a leading man for a future Hallmark movie, just wrapped its second season.

Hallmark is quietly running a hybrid model where reality television feeds scripted romance. **Producer and screenwriter Bennett Graebner** has worked both ends of that pipeline, across 17 years of dating television and a return to screenwriting, and he can explain why the handoff is harder than it looks.

How the Pipeline Actually Works

Finding Mr. Christmas runs ten contestants through holiday-themed acting challenges, and the winner lands the lead in a Hallmark movie. Last season's champion headlined Happy Howlidays. That reality arm sits inside a bigger expansion. Hallmark launched its own streamer, Hallmark Plus, moved into live events, and built a reality slate on top of its scripted catalog.

Each piece pushes viewers toward the same place, which is more Hallmark romance:

- A reality competition that auditions future leads in front of an audience that will watch their movies
- A streaming service, Hallmark Plus, that keeps the catalog and the new formats under one subscription
- Live events like the Hallmark Christmas Experience, where fans pay to meet the stars the

pipeline produces

Hallmark's model rests on scale that cable rivals can't match. Among women 18 and older, the network has ranked as the **most-watched entertainment cable channel** for twelve straight fourth quarters. An Unexpected Valentine topped a year stacked with Christmas titles. That signals the appetite for Hallmark romance now runs year-round, which gives the pipeline more than one season to feed.

Cheap content explains part of the appetite. A reality season costs less to produce than a slate of movies, and it does double duty. It tests potential leads in front of the exact audience that will decide their careers, and it **turns casting into content** people pay to watch. A development executive usually guesses whether a new face will connect. Hallmark gets to watch the audience answer in real time, then hand the winner a movie the audience already wants to see.

Training the Audience's Eye

Creator Jonathan Bennett described the delicate part of the handoff. "We realized the audience isn't used to watching a stage," he told Slate. "So we set it in a house and made the living room look like a Hallmark movie." Producers built the reality show to look like the scripted product so longtime viewers would accept it.

Why the Hybrid Is Harder Than It Looks

A reality competition and a scripted romance ask for different instincts. Casting a charismatic contestant isn't the same as **building a character who can** carry 84 minutes of story. Graebner spent 400-plus episodes learning that the camera rewards genuine emotion and punishes performance.

On his Bachelor sets, the working motto was "embrace the cheese," shorthand for earnest emotion without irony. Hallmark lives on that same sincerity, which is why a contestant who can fake it rarely survives the jump to a scripted lead. The pipeline works only when the person it finds is the real thing.

Graebner's test applies cleanly here. He has **said** that everything starts with whether a moment will make him and the audience feel something, and a contestant coached into a performance can't fake that on a 90-minute scripted clock. Hallmark needs leads who land the earnest beat without a wink. That's the instinct that's hardest to screen for in a competition.

Casting a Person vs. Writing One

Reality casting starts with someone who already exists and finds the story in them. Scripted writing starts with a story and **builds a person to fill** it. A network attempting both has to master two crafts that pull in opposite directions, and most production teams train in only one.

Hallmark compounds the difficulty by manufacturing its own stars. It brings the same faces back across as many as five movies a year, the way old studios did. A reality winner has to slot into that repertory and carry a franchise, not just win a season. Finding the rare contestant who can do both is the whole bet.

What Hallmark Is Really Selling

Hallmark's audience isn't buying surprise. Roughly 36 million viewers come back for the guarantee that **the couple gets together** and the world stays kind. Hallmark's own market research found that the trait defining its most loyal viewers was a belief that the world is a good place.

That certainty is the product, and it raises the stakes on the reality pivot. A competition that produces a dull lead, or a movie that breaks the comfort formula, risks the one thing the audience pays for. Hallmark is gambling against a viewership that tunes in precisely for familiarity.

There's a deeper tension the pivot has to manage. Competition is built on conflict and elimination, and Hallmark sells the absence of both. A reality show that leaned into backstabbing would poison the comfort the brand runs on. So the network sands off the cruelty and keeps the wholesomeness, which is a strange thing to ask of a genre invented to humiliate people on camera. Pulling that off is the real trick, and it's why the format does not transplant cleanly to a network without Hallmark's particular promise.

Where the Pipeline Leads

Hybrid models like this are spreading because they work, with reality formats feeding scripted slates across the wider romance market. Hallmark's version is the most developed, and its 2025 numbers show the model holding even as cable shrinks. Other networks and streamers are watching, because a competition that doubles as a casting call costs less than a development deal and builds an audience before the movie exists.

Copying it is harder than it looks. Its pipeline only works on top of a star system and a base that already trusts the brand. A streamer with a deep catalog but no loyalty has nothing for the winner to step into. Hallmark spent decades building the repertory first. That competition is just the newest way to feed it.

Bennett Graebner moved back into original scripted material after his Bachelor tenure, including a mid-budget romcom. He has produced **romance on the reality side** and written it on the scripted side. He knows the pipeline Hallmark is building, and how hard it is to make both halves work at once. Most networks won't.
