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Where Is Stake Legal? Countries, Restrictions, and Availability Explained

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Stake operates through two separate sites with different products and geographic rules. Stake.com offers real-money casino games, poker and sports betting in permitted countries. Stake.us uses a social sweepstakes model created for eligible US residents.

This distinction matters when answering where is Stake legal. Stake.com is unavailable across the United States, while Stake.us can operate in many states under sweepstakes rules. Access still depends on a player's physical location, age and compliance with the applicable terms.

The rules can change quickly. A state that previously permitted Stake.us may later be added to the operator's excluded-territory list. Players should check the current terms before registering, purchasing Gold Coins or requesting a prize redemption.

Stake.com and Stake.us Are Different Services

Stake.com is a real-money gambling site licensed in Curaçao. It accepts cryptocurrency deposits and offers casino games, sports wagering and poker. Its current terms prohibit access from several countries, including the United States, United Kingdom, Australia, Germany, France, Spain, Italy, Poland, Brazil and Mexico.

Stake.us is not the American version of the same real-money casino. It is a social sweepstakes service that uses two virtual currencies:

- Gold Coins: Used for social play and not redeemable for prizes.
- Stake Cash: A promotional sweepstakes currency that may become redeemable after the stated play requirements are met.

Stake.us states that no purchase is required and that its games do not offer direct real-money gambling. Only eligible customers located in the continental United States or Hawaii may use the service, excluding prohibited states.

Is Stake Legal in the US?

The answer to is Stake legal in US depends on which site is being discussed. Stake.com does not accept users located anywhere in the United States. Its terms list the US as a prohibited jurisdiction for real-money play.

The answer to is Stake legal in the US is different for Stake.us. The social sweepstakes service accepts eligible users in many states, but it does not operate nationwide. Its official terms contain a list of excluded states, and the company may change that list when regulations or internal policies change.

Calling Stake.us “legal across America” would therefore be inaccurate. It is better described as available in permitted states under its sweepstakes model. State regulators may interpret sweepstakes promotions differently, so availability does not equal approval from a state gambling commission.

Stake Legal States and Current Restrictions

As of July 2026, Stake’s official help centre names 22 restricted states. Residents of those locations cannot create or use a Stake.us account.

The current restricted list includes Arizona, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Vermont, Washington and West Virginia.

This leaves 28 Stake legal states for current operational purposes. That figure may change, so older articles claiming access in 33, 43 or another number may reflect an earlier version of the terms.

Is Stake Legal in Florida?

Players asking is Stake legal in Florida are usually referring to Stake.us. Florida is not listed among the excluded states in the current official terms, so eligible residents can access the sweepstakes site.

Florida users should still read the prize and redemption rules before playing with Stake Cash. Sweepstakes promotions may be subject to state-specific prize limits or other conditions. Account verification can require personal information showing that the user meets the location and age rules.

Stake.com remains blocked throughout the United States, including Florida. Access to Stake.us does not make Stake.com legal or accessible there.

Is Stake Legal in Texas?

The answer to is Stake legal in Texas follows the same product distinction. Stake.com cannot accept Texas users because the real-money site excludes the entire United States.

Stake.us is currently available in Texas because Texas does not appear on its prohibited-state list. This may seem unusual because Texas has restrictive laws concerning conventional online casino gambling. Stake.us relies on a social sweepstakes structure rather than direct cash wagers.

Texas residents must still meet the site's eligibility, identity and location requirements. The operator can suspend access when a customer supplies false details or attempts to bypass geographic controls.

Is Stake Legal in Georgia?

People researching is Stake legal in Georgia can currently access Stake.us, subject to its account rules. Georgia is not one of the states excluded by the official terms.

This does not mean that Georgia has licensed Stake as a conventional online casino. Stake.us is offered under sweepstakes rules, with Gold Coins and Stake Cash rather than direct real-money casino balances.

Georgia residents cannot use Stake.com. They should also verify the latest restricted-state list before registering because sweepstakes rules and operator policies can change.

Is Stake Legal in NY?

The answer to is Stake legal in NY is no for both versions. Stake.com excludes all US locations, while Stake.us specifically lists New York as a prohibited state.

A New York resident cannot create an eligible Stake.us account merely by travelling temporarily or using different address details. The terms focus on residency and location, and users may be asked for identity documents during verification.

Attempting to hide a location with a VPN may breach the terms. Stake.com expressly prohibits tools designed to defeat geographic blocking, and Stake.us treats access from an excluded territory as a serious violation.

Is Stake Legal in NJ?

The answer to is Stake legal in NJ is also no. New Jersey appears on the Stake.us excluded-territory list, despite the state permitting licensed online casinos and sportsbooks.

This illustrates why general state gambling laws do not provide the full answer. An operator may be unavailable because it lacks local approval, uses a business model restricted by state policy or has chosen not to serve that jurisdiction.

New Jersey residents should use operators authorised by the state regulator rather than attempting to access either Stake site.

Why Stake Availability Changes

Stake.us restrictions have expanded as several states have reviewed social casino and sweepstakes promotions. California, Illinois, Indiana and Maine are among the states now listed as excluded, even though some older reference pages still mark them as accepted.

The official terms should take priority over third-party state lists. Stake reserves the right to update its excluded territories, and access may also depend on a customer's current location, residency and legal age.

The main rule is simple: Stake.com is unavailable throughout the US, while Stake.us is accessible only in states not named on its current restricted list. Checking the operator's latest terms before registration is the safest way to confirm current availability.

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
